From Father Anthony...

Some weeks ago, I was with a colleague in the garden. We conversed about its shape and beauty, the number of birds and ... pruning! Later, I examined the dishevelled hedge, misshapen bushes and long-haired trees. A rambling rose had rambled too far! Secateurs in hand, it got a short back and sides that would make any Sergeant Major proud! Afterwards I worried that I had been too severe; far from it. It is now better contained and flourishing.

Last week we spoke about the I Am: essence, pure unformed, undifferentiated awareness. It is the Father state, the conceiver (vine). What it conceives of (the branch) extends from it. The conception is one with the conceiver. Yet, they are differentiated; one is dependent on the other for its form. What we conceive ourselves to be is one with who we are but not who we are because we can change our conception of ourselves, for better or worse, to represent our essence. What the Father conceives of (begets) is the Son. The Father expresses the Son through the Spirit. The Son is one with the Father... yet the Father is greater, (I and my Father are one yet the Father is greater). To be fully human is to be aware of participating in this trinitarian experience.

Problems arise when we misidentify the conception as the conceiver, form with essence, e.g. I am one with my name but I am not my name. I can change my name and still be me! If we think of ourselves as that by which we define ourselves, we build our lives on a false foundation (cut off from me you can do nothing) ... a branch confusing itself as the vine and not part of it. Spiritually, it is crucial to sense the difference between vine and branch.

Part of spiritual practice is to sense this Father state, rest in and come from it. This brings spiritual sight; awareness of the thoughts that shape who we think we are. Awareness establishes the correct relationship between Father and Son (vine and branch). From the vantage point of the Father we observe whether who we think we are is expressing our essence. If not, we have fallen short of the mark (sin) and must prune our thinking (repentance) producing conceptions of ourselves (fruit) that better reflect the image and likeness of God we actually are.
