EASTER WEEK 4 GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

From Father Anthony

Apart from occasional cloud and gusts of cold wind it was a day of clear blue and burning yellow. Waves danced, crashed and tumbled over the beach ending in long drawn out sighs; seagulls cried plaintively; dogs barked playfully. The sound of the sea washed over and through me. I closed my eyes and breathed in rhythm with the sea. I felt my body relax and thoughts soften. The sun smiled hotly on my face. It was lovely. Then an ugly, discordant, bullying sound of a siren ripped the moment apart and left it in tatters.

Sound is important. It is an integral part of any spiritual practice. Early in Genesis we read that the 'spirit (breath) of God hovered over the face of the waters'. The word hover (rachaph ('p_means to brood... and by implication, to be relaxed, to flutter, move or shake. The word conveys vibration, sound. It is the sound of God, or the sound of God's 'thoughts', that brings the world into being. His thought vibrates and brings forth out of nothingness all life. Sound is clearly very powerful. When the *Chladni plate*, for example, vibrates in one of its modes, a pattern appears in the sand on the plate. Sound not only arranges matter; it affects emotions too. We all know how music can have us laughing or crying making us happy or sad. Jesus, implies that his sheep *(us)* know His voice *(the sound of Him)*, much as a child knows the sound of a beloved parent. We do not or should not listen to the sound of strangers or follow them. But, who is the real stranger?

Thought is a form of vibration. It vibrates within and subtly affect us, especially our mood. This is why we must learn to control our thoughts. As co -creators with God our thoughts create. And, the first person they affect is us, the thinker, before they take shape in the world and affect others. Whether affected by internal or external stimuli thought resides within. Troubled thoughts can leave us angry or anxious; pleasant thoughts relaxed and happy. To follow Jesus it is necessary for us to learn to distinguish between thoughts that are of Him, that vibrate with the frequency of Christ; and those that do not... the stranger. A simple scan of our feelings and emotions will often serve to reveal which thoughts are dominating.

Month of May - during May we will be singing the Salve Regina after each of the weekday Masses in honour of our Lady.
