From Father Anthony

It was cold. I sat by the river wrapped and warm. Sunlight peeked through cracks in the cloud. Someone called: a dog barked. Water swirled and splashed. I listened and let the sounds flow through me. I had a memory of school... on the highest diving board and scared to death! The PE master climbed up, his face kind but determined, 'you can do it, I know you can'. He did not address my fear but spoke to the confidence he knew I had in me. His confidence awakened my own which overcame the fear. I dived in, survived and never looked back.

'Before you were born I knew you'. God has always known us; He knew you and me before ever we were born. *Whom* God knows us as *is* who we truly are. Scripture tells us that God is Spirit and God is Love; and that we are made in His image. Who we are, then, is a unique, totally loved reflection of that Spirit and Love. To see *(know)* a person truly, is to see them as God sees them; it is to see them as a unique reflection of Spirit and Love.

Love is not just a romantic notion; it is an active spiritual force. It not only creates; it is the medium by which we behold Truth; the medium which takes us beyond our limited notions of who we and others are. It pierces to the core. It recognises itself in the other; and the other finds liberation by being recognised for who they truly are.

St Paul knew this liberating force and wants us to know it too. He is coaxing us to see beneath the surface of sense perception to the spiritual reality of *every* person. It demands that we change our minds and hearts about others: that we see beyond the images and labels society heaps upon us: that we drop our preconceptions of who we think others are and listen with our hearts to who they truly are. Only Love can do this; *it opens the box and liberates*.

Jesus came among them as God and all they saw was the carpenter's son they thought they knew so well. Sense perception blinded them to God! Seeing the reality of another becomes a prophesy to us of who we are! And then... a prophet will always be welcome in his home town!
