# THE MOST HOLY TRINITY (B)

#### From Father Anthony...

The bin overflowed; old papers lay on top of the shredder. The-in-tray was full and I was behind with my work... not to mention unanswered emails. Oh, and the floor needed hoovering! I looked outside; a similar story, grass too long and weeds running riot. The Gunslinger stared at me disparagingly. However, pretty purple headed flowers danced in the wind and made it better. I started tidying up. To my dismay a lovely pot plant had withered... leaves drooping, white flower bent. I *immersed* it in water. That evening, as if by miracle, it came back tall and strong.

We are commissioned to go out to all Nations (the hearts and minds of all people). We are to offer a tired, often frightened and withered people an experience of God. We are to Baptise them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Baptism (from  $\beta\alpha\pi\tau i\zeta\omega$ ) means to immerse – literally, dip under. Physically we can baptise with water. Spiritually, we baptise with Love. We immerse others in our Love; Love being the expression of the Trinity within us. We often hear it said that a couple are immersed in love for one another... a child feels immersed in its parents love. Our experience of God is to be such that when others encounter us they feel immersed in the Love of God. This is at the heart of the spiritual life. We only keep and maintain the Love of God for ourselves by giving it away; things of the Spirit are kept by giving them away.

Mystically, this Love is formed when a meeting with Christ takes place in Spirit (up the mountain): when we remember that He has arranged to meet us. We remember this when we come to know and feel our incompleteness (eleven, not twelve disciples). In this meeting He supplies for our lack and completes us. He establishes a permanent relationship (I am with you till the end of time) ... a relationship characterised by the giving and receiving of the other. He gives Himself: we receive Him. We give by allowing Him to work through us and all our faculties. With Him in us, as us, we are the Son united to the Father by the Holy Spirit. We become Love. As Love we naturally immerse the world and others in Love by simply being who we are. Love.

# CATHOLIC BISHOPS' CONFERENCE OF ENGLAND AND WALES COVID-19 ROUTE MAP: STEP 3 GUIDANCE

**Status Quo:** The current capacity of our churches, our Mass-booking arrangements, hand-sanitising and wearing of face masks remains unchanged. Thank you for continuing to book to attend Mass and to all of our stewards.

**Holy Communion:** Under one kind only but the priest/deacon is now permitted to announce 'Body of Christ', to each communicant in turn as they come forward. Please keep your mask in place as you reply 'Amen'; lifting your mask only to consume the host. Many thanks.

**Readers:** are no longer required to wear gloves but we will continue to have only one lay reader per Mass for now. At Masses where the psalm is sung, cantors will sing from a separate place.

**Private Prayer:** St Osmund's Church will now be open throughout the day, every day for private prayer. On Tuesdays and Thursdays (when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed), if you arrive for private prayer and the church is locked (as it will be when there is no-one present), simply come to the Newman Room (at the back of the Parish Rooms) and we will open the church for you. When visiting for private prayer, there will be no stewards present and so we ask you to sanitise your hands and check-in on arrival (either using the displayed QR code or by writing your name on the list in the entrance), wear a mask whilst in the building and clean the area around your seat before you leave. A spray bottle and cloths will be available in the porch for you to use.

## The Most Holy Trinity - Sunday 30 May

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the foundation of our faith. On it everything else depends and from it everything else derives. Hence the Church's constant concern to safeguard the revealed truth that God is One in nature and Three in Persons.
