ADVENT WEEK 1 (A)





The wind was icy, the rain relentless; black clouds brooded above. Winter had barged in from the West, leaving chaos and floods across the country. I felt for those who had suffered damage. The garden is now shorn and skeletal; winter preparation for the new life of spring to come and the fruits and flowers of summer... Where we see bare earth, the farmer sees the crop to come.

Advent is a time of preparation for interior spiritual birth. A time to look inside at the person we are; the ground ready and ripe for transformation. The tired sights and old images we manufactured as ourselves must be transformed into who we truly are, the clear image of God.

There are two basic aspects to humanity. One aspect is when we are specifically wedded to the world through the senses. We look *outside* with longings, desires, keeping face, being a part of the crowd; this becomes the horizon we race towards. But... the closer we get the further it recedes. We are constantly seeking but never finding. It leaves us tired, unhappy and restless. The other aspect is when we come to rest and, rather than looking outside, look within seeking who we truly are. Until this time the two aspects live together, *eating and drinking, making merry*. When we are sincere and ready to let go... the flood comes! The powers of our soul release us from the bonds of the earth so, like the Arc, we can rise and ascend in spirit... *two men will be out in the field one will be taken one will be left*.

Advent is a time of preparation for the necessary separation of these two aspects. It's not that the earthly is bad: it is effect, a derivative but not cause. Spirit is Cause; only Spirit will give us true peace, understanding, creative ability and sight of God. It is this we must want, intend and desire. The *flood* takes place in God's time not ours. He knows when we are ready. So, the Gospel tells us to *stay awake* in readiness for it. It reminds us that it is what He does in us not what we do for ourselves. Our part is to want, prepare and be ready for it because, "*Christ could be born a thousand times in Galilee but all in vain if not in me*". (*Angelus Silesius*)
