All Saints

From Father Anthony...

I pottered about the garden: it looked limp and faded. The Gunslinger followed closely. Mrs Cat eyed me from a distance. I was irritated. I had correctly identified a lamp shade from several others but couldn't work out how to fit it. The fixture had three prongs to hold it. I pushed them, pulled them, squeezed them... nothing. I phoned a friend! 'Only one prong will pull out', he said, 'find it and the shade will fit... if it's the right shade'. The shade now fits!

Intuition correctly identified the shade; but I had no understanding of how the fitment worked. I had 'faith' that it would all come together but couldn't work out how. Until then both shade and fitment had to remain separate, disconnected. My friend's guidance led me to understanding. I moved beyond *faith* that it would work to *knowledge* of how it worked: the fitting and shade came together... a secular example of St Anselm's *fides quarens intellectum - faith seeking understanding*. Spiritually, we don't have to understand God in God's entirety in order to have faith. Faith comes first: understanding may follow and if so leads to Knowledge.

In spiritual practice we attempt to give sufficient weight to two opposite forces (*beatitudes*) so as to find the equilibrium of balance; wisdom and understanding bring knowledge; freedom and boundaries bring harmony: victory and surrender bring foundation and so on. It is this 'equilibrium of balance' that Jesus points to with the Scribe. It is this equilibrium that the Saints attain in understanding the beatitudes. The Scribe not only intuited the truth (*faith*) of the commandments but understood them in a manner bordering on knowledge. He spoke 'wisely' (vouv $\epsilon \chi \tilde{\omega} \zeta$, wisely, from vo $\tilde{\omega} \zeta$ Mind, Understanding and $\check{\epsilon} \chi \omega$ to Have: mindfully) ... a very spiritually developed Scribe indeed and a model for us to follow.

And what is it that both Scribe and Saint understand. That there is only God; God in everything as everything and everything in God... and yet, not contained by His own creation: He is beyond and greater than it all *(He is one there is no other)*. When Wisdom reveals this and Understanding explains it we have Knowledge. We no longer see the world but the Kingdom of Heaven in the world. Our relationship to everything is changed because, even in a speck of dust we sense only God. We are always in His Presence.

I based these thoughts on the Gospel Readings for both the 31st Sunday of the Year (B) and All Saints.

For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission

A two-year synodal process is taking place in the Catholic Church from October 2021 that culminates in a final Synod Gathering of Bishops in Rome in October 2023. This process was launched universally by Pope Francis on 10 October in Rome, by all

bishops at Diocesan level on 17 October and last weekend by our priests at parish level. So that we can all fully understand what Pope Francis is asking for with our participation in the Synod, there are a number of information sessions taking place around our diocese including two online sessions for those who cannot travel or who would prefer to join online. The nearest one to us is on **Saturday 6 November 10am-12noon** in **St John's Centre**, **Trowbridge** and there are others at Brockworth, Bristol & Bridgwater. To join the **online sessions (8th & 9th November 7pm-9pm)**, please email the parish office *office@salisburycatholics.org* and we will arrange for a link to be sent to you so that you can join from the comfort of your own home! We encourage everyone to join in this process and later on in November (20th) we will be sending a delegation from our parishes to a diocesan gathering in Bristol as our representatives.
