From Father Anthony

Fine rain and car exhaust clogged the air. Tires squelched and running lights bounced off wet tarmac. I skipped the traffic lights and made my way to the shops... trying to remember what I wanted and wishing I'd made a list! I enjoyed the rain on my face but not down my neck. Shopping in hand I made my way back and stopped to chat with a shopkeeper friend. He was unloading his van, 'That should keep us stocked for a while', he said.

'...you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!' The 'certain rich man', referred to in the Gospel passage represents you and me; the land producing a bountiful harvest represents aspects of our minds, material, intellectual, emotional: which leads to the spiritual. There is nothing wrong with material, intellectual and emotional abundance: the passage points, obliquely, to all abundance coming from God. God is abundance not scarcity; so we are right to expect abundance. As co-creators with God we should know what we want and set out to achieve it, working in prayer, trust and perseverance; with the spiritual goal of coming closer to God until we transcend closeness and become one with God in Spiritual Union. We wake up and recognise God in and as everything; yet, know that He is beyond it all, too... we are left in sheer Awe.

However, we mostly use our mind, intellect and emotion, in service of the material world in the hope that it will bring us comfort, ease and happiness; which it accomplishes in illusion but without substance. The true goal of the material is the spiritual from which it emerges; not itself. Mind in service of the material leads to an experience of night and death, 'this night your life will demanded of you'. Whereas, Mind used in service of Spirit leads to an experience of Eternal life, now.

If we wish to progress from the material to the spiritual, from night to day, then, with St Paul and without any strain, guilt or fear we must assess ourselves in terms of *immorality, impurity, passion, evil desires, greed, lying* and so on. Not as a guilt trip but to experience and recognise the 'old self' in us. Then we will know what to let go of in order that the new self (spiritual self in the world) may emerge.
