From Father Anthony...

Steam rose from the mug of tea warming my hands. Silvery breath billowed in icy air. It was dry with pockets of hardened slush. The wind had retreated leaving sunshine breaks in the cloud. Blackbirds hopped across the lawn, chasing and chuckling. Gangsters loitered on roof tops; the Gunslinger swooped and tracked my movements. The garden felt cold and looked skeletal. But, in the drabness, one solitary red rose – like last year - bowed its head with a splash of colour; a herald of new life to come.

New life (spiritual life) lies dormant within each of us. It slumbers like an embryo waiting to be woken and fed with awareness and love. As this new life dawns in us, we begin to cast off old ways; becoming the new life we waken to. There is transformation, a manifestation of something new within... an Epiphany.

What the Nativity of Jesus recounts in history we can experience spiritually. It is a first hand experience, deeply personal and unique to each one of us. Words and concepts are second hand and fail. If pushed, we might describe it as an experience of God as a child; we care for this child; lavish our attention, affection and love on Him. As love for the child deepens we recognise our family resemblance to Him. We watch the child grow and mature and understand the adult; we are at ease with Him. We know Him! Having had the pleasure of loving Him (God) as a child we relax and allow Him the pleasure of loving us. It is a relationship characterised by 'giving the other the pleasure of giving and receiving love'.

This mystical experience might emerge when life routinely feels drab, cold and pointless. Our innate spiritual wisdom (Gold) finds a voice; it wakens us. There is a journey of transformation; from worldly to spiritual consciousness (Frankincense). It reveals the eternity of Spirit; its eternal Love for us (Myrrh). The experience is vulnerable. It needs protecting from the harsh, worldly thoughts and desires that kill it (Herod within). We learn to exercise the spiritual states of Mary (push away what is not of God) and Joseph (protect the spiritual life emerging). These states lead us to the land of mystical prayer. Here, we are led by His voice: here we find the refuge and protection needed for the child within to grow and mature.



Mary, The Holy Mother of God - Friday 1 January

In the early centuries of the Church, once Christmas began to be celebrated as its own feast on December 25 (having originally been celebrated with the Feast of the Epiphany, on January 6), the Octave (eighth day) of Christmas, January 1, took on a special meaning. In the East, and throughout much of the West, it became common to celebrate a feast of Mary, the Mother of God, on this day. THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

In 2017, the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales restored this Holy Day of Obligation to its original place on 6 January (having been previously moved to the Sunday). However, in 2018 & 2019, 6 January fell on either a Saturday or a Sunday which meant that we did not notice the effect of this change. This year, it falls on a Wednesday and although the obligation to attend Mass is currently waived, there is a Mass being celebrated in each of our churches and an Ordinariate Mass - see back page for details.
