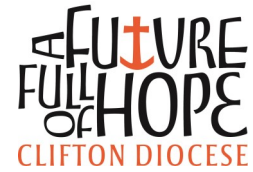

From Father Anthony

Another sweltering day. Tourists wilted and slouched as they gazed upon the Cathedral. People sprawled on the lawns, children played and a dog ran up to be fussed. I retreated to the cloisters and sat against a wall to cool off. I gazed out through open arched windows onto the quadrangle. The tower loomed above, immense and brooding, surrounded by the haunting cries of peregrines. The gentle hubbub was shattered by the arrival of a group of children. In they came, two by two, full of noise and cheer... followed by an exhausted teacher!

I thought of the Gospel... *'The Lord sent them out two by two'*. The children's cheer lifted my heart, *'The seventy-two came back rejoicing'* and it made me reflect. *'Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals'*. The only burden they seemed to carry was their school bags... yet burdens are not just physical. There is something absolutely and utterly unique about each one of us. Yet, all too often we define ourselves and others by the limited and often false labels given us by society. We label others as *average, offender, important* and so on; as if we *are* those labels. What a burden! No wonder there is little cheer! You and I are unique; we have family resemblance with God. He cannot be contained by a label and by extension nor can we. If we judge ourselves by worldly terms then we will be saddled with and live by labels that do not adequately describe who we truly are; we will be left with the disappointment of error. We have to learn to lose the labels and experience ourselves and others as *Images of the Father*; then we will begin to resemble *His likeness* in what we do and say.

To liberate ourselves spiritually from the burden of labels we should dwell on 'wholeness', *'peace to this house'*. The root of the word used for *peace* means *to tie together into a whole: Peace is God's gift of wholeness... which we are*. A label describes a part of a person not the whole. When the Lord visits, He visits in the Truth of our Being which is whole, not a part. We must see the whole in order to be the agent of His visit; this brings rejoicing and an awareness that we have always been known by God... *our names are written in Heaven*.

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF ST OSMUND'S CHURCH

Sadly, as a result of plaster chunks falling from the ceiling, and with professional and Diocesan advice, we have closed St Osmund's Church until further notice. I hope to come back to you by the middle to end of July with an update and way forward; but not much can be done before then.

Our temporary solution is to move Sunday Masses to Holy Redeemer Church with same timings: and continue with Weekday Masses, the Saturday morning Mass and Ordinariate Masses in St Osmund's Parish Hall with the same timings.

You will understand that these circumstances are beyond my control and that your health and safety must come first. I'll keep you updated. Love and prayers.
