LENT WEEK 3(B)

From Father Anthony

I made a dash from the car to the supermarket but got soaked anyway! Basket in hand I trawled the aisles mostly putting into it what I did not need. A normal shop then! Treats for the gunslinger, gangsters and brown sparrows came to hand: I forgot the eggs and spaghetti. At the end of an aisles stood a little girl. Her face puckered and slowly crumpled into tears. She was lost. A lady rushed over, took her by the hand and reunited her with mum. Cuddles and happiness. The world is lost, I thought; it is up to us to lead it to Christ!

Evangelization, we have said, has to do with bringing others to Christ (reaching their minds and hearts) by coming from our own personal encounter with Christ. At the transfiguration we saw the disciples encounter Christ as the spiritual being He is. Spirit, which is its own light, illuminates the physical person from within. Our encounter with Christ will light us from within. It will awaken us from our earthly slumber in the 'coffin' of a physical body. This week we see Jesus meeting the Samaritan woman at the well. Samaria means watch tower. Spiritually it refers to that part of the soul which gathers information from the outside world which, in turn, conditions our thoughts and especially our emotions. Samaritans were a mixed race and so we also understand mixed thoughts and feeling. In the Gospel we have a beautiful picture of Spirit (Jesus) resting with our objective intellect. We see the intellect questioning Jesus (how, why, where), and slowly, by degrees Jesus inspiring it with spiritual vison (living water). The effect on the woman (the soul) is to go and bring others to Jesus so that they can say "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the saviour of the world". Is this not evangelism?

Like the Gospel writers we must become evangelists. We have to tell the story of our encounter with Christ so as to awaken others to Christ within them. Just as Christ is encountered on the mountain so He is encountered by the well. If the well represents the thoughts we live by (ordinary water) then by observance, attentiveness and questioning of them... we might find Christ resting there, transforming them into spiritual thoughts (living water).

THE FIRST SCRUTINY FOR THE ELECT OF OUR PARISH

The Elect are those who desire to be fully incorporated into the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. They will be here with us over the coming weeks for the next liturgical rites in this process: the Scrutinies, the Presentation of the Creed and the Our Father. The Scrutinies of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults are celebrated on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent. It is recommended that on these Sundays **'Year A'** readings are used as they closely parallel the conversion journey toward baptism and powerfully convey the importance of faith in Christ as the mark of readiness to follow his way. It is also recommended that *the entire parish pray and reflect on the same readings as the Elect, even if the Elect will not be present at every Mass on these Sundays*.

The Elect will be presented for the first scrutiny this Sunday at the 9am Mass at St Osmund.
