From Father Anthony...

Summer pushed back against the closing doors of Autumn. People strolled about in shorts and tee shirts. Dogs panted, ducks splashed in the canal. Children threw bread and shrieked with laughter. I wish I'd worn a hat! A father hid behind a tree and called his daughter. She turned, pondered, looked as if to cry, then stumbled forwards. He sprang out, gathered her in his arms, and spun her round. Her face lit up... brighter than the sun!

The goal of spiritual life is to heal the Separation from God (the Fall): to feel His spiritual arms around us once more; to experience the union we had with Him before the Separation; to heal the disconnectedness we experience within and with one another. Like the little girl, hearing the call makes us aware of the separation. It causes a spiritual action within us to search for who made the sound (ascension); as we ascend (move towards), God descends to join us. The scriptures refer to this joining as a marriage (union); it requires an open, childlike quality. It is this quality we are encouraged to develop in order to experience union (He put his arms round them).

The *call* is often experienced as confusion, discontent, 'wondering what it is all about'... becoming unsatisfied with the known. Yet, how do we move beyond ourselves to the caller? Traditionally, three areas are involved; *intellectual study, prayer and meditation* and *purification of character* – sometimes called the Work or the Way. Words like sin, repentance, righteousness, sanctification, purification and so on, are used. Beware! words come with images that can put us off! We must try to *hear* beyond words and feel the experience they attempt to describe.

For example, what in our character gets in the way of moving towards God? Traditionally, spiritual schools would answer: *pride, envy, resentment, gossiping, anger, vengeance, lust, promiscuity, lying, wanting honours, giving verbal abuse, tricking others, over indulging, stealing, blaspheming* and so on. It's not popular to mention these today: yet spiritually and practically, their effect is to keep us tied to ourselves and deaf to God. Liberation from them *(purification of character)* is an ascension, a *movement beyond.* In this new space we experience a childlike vulnerability *(the unknown).* This is the space where union takes place.

Daunting? Yes. But work in one area is enough to begin the process; enough to make us smile within.
