From Father Anthony

I found a stretch of beach nestling below rough, craggy cliffs. It was covered with tightly packed pebbles of various sizes, rounded and smoothed by years of relentless wave action. I stumbled about, picking up pieces of coloured glass; jade green, azure blue, beer brown and frosted white. They glinted like jewels in the afternoon sun. With languid sighs, waves unfolded and lapped at the pebble dashed shoreline with the retreating sound of a thousand hands clapping. A trawler lay at anchor in the distance: gulls danced and swooped around its stern. Puffs of cloud caught their own reflection off the gentle swell. A grand day!

Last week Jesus taught in the synagogue (the gathering place of our thoughts). His teaching helps us to grow (taught with authority); it has the effect of purifying our unclean or error thoughts, dispelling them. But, these thoughts have a secondary or reflected action. Projected onto the screen of our world we receive their reflection back in myriad ways... sickness, despondency, lack, fear, terror and so on. This week, Jesus leaves the synagogue, our mentality, to deal with the effects of these reflections which lodge in us. Spiritually, this reflected action is Simon's mother in law. Simon means to hear, mother in law represents soul in service of the world, not spirit, i.e. hearing and responding according to the world and not spirit. The effect of these reflected thoughts cause dysfunctions of the mind (fever) and incapacitate us. Jesus takes her by the hand. The hand is what creates: it is a symbol of creative consciousness. Dysfunctional projections return negative forms and phantoms. Joining His hand to hers He lifts her out of the effects of these and transfers His own consciousness; restoring in her the creative consciousness of the Presence and Power of God. Now, the mind, healed of illusions, can serve Him and, by extension, the world.

Jesus rises and prays before dawn which occurs in the east... a symbol of spirit. He prays in Spirit. Here He discerns between worldly and spiritual thinking, i.e. Simon telling him the crowds are waiting as opposed to going to the other villages. We serve the world not by servicing our own thoughts (the crowds are waiting) but by going out to others (nearby villages) and awakening Christ within their own mentality (preaching in their synagogues). This is our spiritual purpose on earth.
