EASTER WEEK 3

From Father Anthony

It had rained hard all night long. Water dripped from gutters, trees shed blossoms, paths glistened, the sun a dull bulb behind dirty net curtains. Doves cooed and courted on the church roof as the Gunslinger sang a morning anthem; the sun peeped out from behind the dirty curtains. I drank my tea and watched a blackbird peck at the soaked lawn... but it found nothing!

So, they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. What a wonderful depiction of mankind wedded to the world through the five senses (boat), using only sensory information (night) to attempt to capture and understand (fishing) the realm of spirit, its true food... and failing (caught nothing). At best life's a pleasant dream; at worst a nightmare. In either case a dream, what the world confuses as reality! Deep down we know or feel that there is more to life than the experience we are having: that something must dawn in us and awaken us to the problem; that we have allowed our minds (nets) to be formed by and serve the world which brings us nothing.

The way forward is to use our minds to 'face' the realm of spirit (pay out your nets to the right or east; east represents the realm of spirit). Obviously, we must intend and desire to catch something, recognise that we cannot do it on our own and that we don't know what to do (you cannot know what you don't know). At this point Jesus, through our experience of and openness to the Holy Spirit, instructs us to do the same thing, live our same life (go fishing) with the difference the He directs and guides our attention to the spiritual meaning and experience of earthly events. We turn our minds away from the world to face Him who is spirit, understanding and knowledge. He is the Catch. He fulfils us. It is Him we bring to the world to transform it (drag the net ashore)

Through prayer and reflection, we allow Jesus to pull back the curtain of our minds; in His light we glimpse spiritual realties which we bring to the world. It is a journey without distance; moving from where we are to where we have always been... but what journey! Darkness becomes light: ignorance, understanding; hate, love: and loneliness... friendship with all humanity in His company.

A Conclave to elect a new Pope begins on Wednesday 7 May

Only those Cardinals under the age of 80 are allowed to vote. Although there are 135 who qualify, 2 will be absent due to ill health.

The election takes place exclusively in the Sistine Chapel within the Vatican Apostolic Palace, which will remain completely sealed off until the election is concluded.
