ADVENT WEEK 2 (C)

From Father Anthony...

I had a few days off and went up North. It was fresh and bracing. Waves foamed and Gulls pierced the air. A wide sapphire sky leaned forward and touched the sea. It was a wilderness of blue broken only by the distant Yorkshire coastline. I relaxed but soon felt the 'valleys and hills' of worry and concern. I sank deeper into the sights and sounds. Nature gently restored my inner equilibrium and I remembered that Advent is a time for inner preparation; for clearing what hinders the birth of Christ within.

The Gospel begins, 'In the Fifteenth year ...' Biblically fifteen represents more than a number. It represents salvation, healing, fulness... ascension from the physical to the spiritual. For example, there are fifteen Psalms of Ascent: one had to ascend fifteen steps into the Temple: in biblical lunar months the Full Moon falls on the fifteenth day... as the moon reflects the sun's light similarly, the intellect reflects the light of Spirit. A full moon indicates an intellect fully reflecting Spirit... a spiritual fruit of Advent.

If we believe, individually or collectively, that we are the cause of our own light we live in error and darkness. We live by false, worldly 'light' that hinders the experience of Salvation: 'light' that reflects man made ideals, interpretations and prejudices (*Caesar*, *Pilate*, *Annas*, *etc*). We live in a world that talks *about* and makes images of God that only keep us separated *from* Him. Awareness of this tragedy creates the *desire* to be *saved* (*ascend*) from it. It awakens in us a distant memory of God: that we are His image (*reflection*) striving to become His likeness.

In the *wilderness we* seek inner equilibrium. We let go of unnecessary worldly, intellectual and emotional attachments. A space is created where God can be remembered. We understand how identification with the world has *dismembered* our nature. *Re-membering* it restores us to our original image (*Zachariah means, God remembers*). We recognise that our 'cares', (*valleys and hills*) hinder remembrance; so, we drop (*level*) them and experience the graciousness (*grace, touch*) of God. The son of Zachariah, *i.e. the fruit of remembrance*, is John... John means *God is Gracious*. John represents the highest perception and reception of Spirit, the forerunner of Jesus (Spirit *incarnated*). In this state *the Word of God comes to us...* we remember who we are and Christ is born within.





ST OSMUND - SATURDAY 4 DECEMBER

Osmund was known for his administration, scholarship and purity. Strict with himself and with others, he lacked avarice and ambition at a time when these traits were common in Church and State. He was present at the council of Sarum, when in 1086 the results of the Domesday survey were presented to the king. He is the patron saint of our town and, of course, of one of our parishes and so to celebrate this **Patronal Feast, there will be mince pies, tea and coffee served after the 10am Mass in St Osmund's to which everyone is warmly welcome.**

THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY TUESDAY 8 DECEMBER

The Church's teaching on the Immaculate Conception asserts that, 'from the first moment of her conception, the Blessed Virgin Mary was, by the singular grace and privilege of Almighty God, and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of Mankind, kept free from all stain of original sin'. The observance of this feast began with a Papal encyclical by Pope Pius IX in December 1854. Later, in 1858, the Blessed Mother gave her name to St Bernadette at Lourdes stating, "I am the Immaculate Conception." For more details, click on the image in the 'Top News' box or click here
