From Father Anthony

Out of the early morning darkness a thin ribbon of translucent light emerged along the horizon. Faint at first, it expanded into a fiery red haze from which streaks of pink, blue, mauve and orange blazed across the sky. It danced off a flat, glassy sea and gave form to the distant hills of North Yorkshire. For a moment I lost my concerns, worries and preoccupations in its magnificence; for a moment I felt soaked in and refreshed by the splendour of such indescribable light. Crows and seagulls seemed to agree as they lined the beach and faced the sun.

To truly meet you, 'I must not be there'! That is, it is better if I 'leave myself behind' along with my preconceived ideas of who and what you are. I must attempt to understand you as you are... not as I am. There is a sense in which I can become an empty vessel for you. This emptiness is not negative. It allows you to release yourself from yourself: to pour yourself out without any fear of judgement or rejection. However, because it is 'emptiness' all you will get back is yourself because the other 'is not there'; and this might be distressing if what you pour out is dark and depressing!

Along with the emptiness there must also be a quality of fullness; something to meet. There must be a condition that reveals the truth about what you pour out; a condition that refines it, clarifies it, heals it and brings it alive so that you can see, feel and know yourself better. That fullness *(pleroma)* we often refer to as Light... spiritual Light. Jesus says, 'You are the light of the world'. You and I *are* the light of the world.

St Paul talks about 'knowing nothing in himself except Christ'... the Light. I 'get out of the way of myself' in order to allow this Light to shine so that you may become aware of the Light in you too. The Light in one brings forth the Light in the other, (where two or three are gathered together in my name, I am there too, Mt 18.20)

How is this State arrived at? By coming into its presence (presence of Christ). We pour ourselves into this Presence (prayer). Here we are enlightened, forgiven and restored: here we become the Light that will heal and restore others.



BUILDING WORKS IN ST OSMUND CHURCH

We have more good news! With the work on the south side of the roof (external) completed ahead of schedule, the work on the *inside* of the church is now able to begin - also ahead of schedule. Well done and thank you to everyone involved in bringing this about. Work begins in earnest on Monday 6 February on the north aisle (above the internal scaffolding) and will move to the south aisle in due course. There will be strictly NO PARKING other than our priests on site during this time as contractors will need freedom to use the driveway at all times.

ALL Weekday Masses which would normally be held in St Osmund Church will once again take place in the Parish Rooms with one exception - 'The Mass for the Sick of Our Parish' on Friday 10 February at 7pm will be in the church to enable Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Confessions. The organ area will be boarded over to prevent dust damage to the organ so we *may* not have use of the organ every weekend. Masses in the Parish Rooms will continue to be livestreamed via a mobile camera but you must select the MOBILE tab on the Church TV - immediately above and to the left of the viewing panel.

PLEASE NOTE - there will be no Exposition and Benediction on Tuesday and Thursday until further notice.

RITE OF ELECTION - SATURDAY 25 FEBRUARY

On the first Saturday of Lent, as at the start of every Lent, our diocesan family gathers together at Clifton Cathedral to celebrate the Rite of Election, where those who are journeying towards becoming part of our Catholic community are presented to Bishop Declan. Here, family and friends, sponsors and godparents, join with those preparing for Baptism (catechumens) and those preparing to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church (candidates). There are two important elements to this Rite - a sending and a receiving. We, the parish, 'send' those planning to join our Church at Easter. This is our public pronouncement that they are ready to enter a covenant relationship through participation in the sacramental life of the Church. Those who are 'sent' can then be received: the Bishop accepts the parish community's judgement, receives them and invites them to enter their names in the Book of the Elect. This year, we are delighted to be 'sending' 5 adults to Clifton Cathedral from our parish and all parishioners are welcome to travel to Clifton Cathedral for this liturgy.
