From Fr Anthony...

Early morning rain, fine as needles, drenched the garden. I was refreshingly soaked through! Red velvet roses poked through emerald green vines. Clusters of baby grapes swayed back and forth against gusts of wind. Boiling black clouds bubbled overhead. The sun burst through for a moment and then another blast of rain bounced off the church roof. I clocked a pair of eyes set in a grumpy face under the bay tree. They blinked a greeting. I blinked back. Mrs Cat swished her silky black tail and looked away... I was dismissed!

As rain trickled down my back I thought of the psalm, 'you give them their food in due season'. The natural world takes what it is given; sun, rain, wind, snow, cold. It does not complain. It does not criticise and wish for something different. It is always engaged in direct experience, the here and now... reality. Awareness of the here and now - not experienced through the filter of the past or the future, but as it is now - leads us ever more deeply to the encounter with Christ who is Eternally Now. We begin to experience 'the sacrament of the present moment' and, 'abandon ourselves to Divine Providence'.

Our wise and learned nature is mostly focused on the abstract; the why, what and how of things and events. It has its place but obscures the experience of first-hand experience. Our 'mere child' nature (the spiritual aspect of the soul, not its sentient aspect) does not deal in concepts, worldly wisdom or learning; it neither lives in the past nor anticipates the future. Like the body, it is always present, always in reality, where Christ is found. It 'shoulders the yoke of Christ'. It shares the same load, at the same time and moves in the same direction. It is one with Him. There are no questions or unknowns in Christ because everything originates in and has its being through Him... "through him all came to be". Sharing in Him, our experience is secure, serene, light and peaceful because everything is truly known, understood and accepted. We do not look to or think of things and events. We come from them because we are one with them. Transformed, we become meek (gentle in heart). The word used does not mean weakness but power without harshness, sharing Christ's strength under His control. It means... returning love for negativity.



OPENING FOR MASS

As I write this, I have not celebrated a Mass in our churches with a congregation present for 110 days. Tomorrow that will change as we open our churches for Mass with limited congregations. It's tempting to say that we're 'getting back to normal' but we're not - this is a step forward, not back and a tentative one at that!

Thank you to everyone who has made opening our church buildings for Mass possible. It has been a lot of work to wade through the guidelines, work out how they apply to us, get our buildings ready and ensure we have all the correct protocols in place to minimise risk of transmission. Many people have been involved, my thanks to you all.

Thank you also to every parishioner that has 'booked' to come to Mass. If feels all wrong to have to 'book' a space at Mass and I thank you for your co-operation. It is important to reaffirm that, at present, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended and I fully support all those who are remaining at home - either by choice or because you are shielding. Our livestream Masses are continuing as before - the only timetable changes will be on Sundays as we revert to our previous Mass times of 09:00, 11:00 & 18:00 to allow the maximum number of people to attend in person.

Attending Mass in person? Please read on...

- Please do NOT come to the church (even if you have booked) if you have any of the symptoms of COVID-19.
- There will be no holy water in the stoups at the entrances. Please sanitise your hands on arrival.
- There will be stewards at each Mass wearing PPE (single-use apron and gloves and a face covering).
- It is not mandatory for the congregation to wear a face covering but you may choose to do so.
- The church has been marked out to clearly indicate which seats may be used.
- Please follow the direction of the stewards with regards to where to sit, when to move forward for Communion and when to depart after Mass. All movement around the church will be organised in order to maintain correct social-distancing.
- Reception of Holy Communion after the prayer 'Behold the Lamb of God'..., the priest will elevate the Sacrament and proclaim 'The Body/Blood of Christ' to the congregation who will reply 'Amen'. There will be no individual dialogue between the priest and communicant at the point of reception. Communion will be under one kind and in the hand only.
- There will be no singing.
- The guidance received states that the homily should be brief and that the Prayer of the Faithful and the offertory procession will be omitted.
- There will be a retiring collection only. However, please be aware that the safest way to contribute to the parish is by standing order/direct transfer. Please see previous page.

'Booking' to attend Mass

Social-distancing requirements mean that there will be a limited number of spaces permissible for each Mass and so there is a need to 'book' a place so that we can control numbers and thereby adhere to regulations. Please do not arrive at a church hoping to attend Mass if you have not booked in advance.

There is a centralised booking system for all three of our churches: to book please call 01722 562703 or email outreach@salisbury catholics.org Bookings will only be taken on this number and email address.

Whilst we are not encouraging advance bookings for consecutive Sundays in the interests of fairness, you are very welcome to ring on a Friday to see if there are any spaces remaining. Booking will be on a first come/first served basis. When you book, we will ask your name and how many members of your family will be attending. Each household will have to book separately.
