LENT WEEK 2(A)

From Father Anthony

There was a moment during one of the weekday masses, just after the Gospel, when we sat in silence together; you could have heard a pin drop. The only sounds were birdsong and distant traffic... which only intensified the silence. It was sublime. I felt the cares and worries of the world melt away and a sense of the real me smiling back: the effects lasted for the rest of the day.

"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." Among other things Lent is a time for interior listening amid the noise of the world. 'Listen to Him.' The word used, akouó (ἀκούω, from which we get the word acoustic) means to hear, to listen, to comprehend by hearing. Spiritually: a state whereby we can be taught by God's inward communication. We listen within so as to hear (comprehend) God communicating with us.

The Gospel passage tells us how to do this but in a subtle manner! Tightly bound to the physical events, which the Gospel passage records, are the spiritual realities which underpin them. We must use our spiritual eyes and ears to see and hear what is contained within these historical events.

Spiritually, Peter, James, John and Jesus represent four aspects of humanity: Body, Soul, Spirit and Ego, *i.e.* our *Individuality, I Am. Going up the mountain* represents leaving the psychological, physical world for the world of Spirit... silence. Here we attempt to listen *and hear*. By turning away from our habitual life with its cares and worries (*going up the mountain*) we begin to feel the Love (*Jesus*) which we are shining back. Love is the motivating force: we let it lead us beyond the silence. It brings forth and combines our *natural wisdom (Moses)* with our *innate power and resolution (Elijah)*. The dialogue between them (*conscience*) transforms us in body, soul and spirit (*the three tents*). It is this transformation we bring to the world (*coming back down the mountain*): not by talking about it (*tell no one*) but by *being it*, *i.e.* raising ourselves above our habitual, worldly and dead ways of thought, word and deed (*until the son of man has risen from the dead*).

During Lent let us seek this silence so as to feel the Love which we are... and listen *(comprehend)* to it. It will gently transform us and our dealings with the world.
