## EASTER WEEK 6

#### **From Father Anthony**

We passed by Downton Chapel. Curtains of water drifted across the lane. Through hedgerows and thickets of trees, a deep copper sun, frowning beneath a monk's cowl of blue-black cloud eased down into the West. The last of its fiery rays set fire to the horizon and the sky writhed and blazed like a smouldering furnace. Spectacular! Agnes *(the BMW)* pulled through the gears, and splashed along until we fused with the main road and on home.

We are told that Jesus lays down his life for us. Externally, He dies for us. Internally, His life, the perfect image of the Father, is fused with ours: the point of *fusion* expressed as 'I Am'. In a spiritual sense the journey of life is not about travelling streets, fulfilling careers, starting a family and so on. The exterior life has value in so far as it leads us to the depth of our interior life; ultimately it is about journeying back to the place where we experience our origin... our 'I Am': the core of our being, the centre from which we truly operate. Here we remember and recognise our affinity with the Divine. It is here that we, *'remain in my love'*. We are no longer *slaves* to the world; we no longer listen to or follow the *'hired man'*, *i.e.* the external world with its news, political speeches, advertising, cajoling and attempts at educating us to become its clones. We find and listen to a voice that comes from the very centre of our being; the place where Free Will and God's Will fuse into one; His voice becomes our voice, our voice His... a healing voice the world craves to hear.

Having found the life of Jesus laid down within us, we must now, in a similar manner, lay down our life over others. We must fuse with others and the world in order to transform them! Love is the ingredient that brings about this 'fusion'. We must 'prefer' in others (*Love*) all that is of God. We must find out who the other person is; attempt to see and understand the world from their standpoint: we must go beyond self-centredness and self-absorption and lay our being over theirs; becoming one with them in spirit. The journey of two becomes the journey of one as we fuse together as 'I Am'... obeying the command to *love one another*.
