From Father Anthony...

Like a golden balloon the sun floated up over rooftops and kissed the world with light. Pungent damp air heralded Autumn. Garden colours have faded but red hot pokers stand defiant and one tree is speckled with bright red apples. Noisy Gangsters flapped about. I was relieved to see the gunslinger, who had been absent for a while. He stood his ground and eyed me accusingly! I smiled, sat very still, closed my eyes and listened deeply to the silence.

We spoke about worldly thinking and being ('clinging to human traditions'); of the need to create the space of awareness from where our inner being can be observed. This place of observation is often referred to as the *I Am (Christ centre)*. Here it is we see, think and feel with Christ; we are led by Him by becoming one with Him.

Through observation (journey) we become aware of our unspiritual self; from hard outer sensations (אַנּדֹלּדֹר Tyre, means hard) through wild, untamed thoughts that trap us (צִּידוֹן Tsiydon, Sidon means wild), to major thought systems (Δεκάπολις, Decapolis means ten cities) and into the power of the mind (אַלִיל Galiylah, Galilee means circuit). Remember, turning away from Christ because we cannot understand Him, can be the beginning of our return to Him. Because, when we turn from Him, He stays with us. He journeys with us and is experienced as the Observer.

With regular observation comes the realisation that we only hear 'worldly voices': voices that cannot speak to the deeper need we increasingly feel. Intuitively, we know another voice is missing but cannot hear it (deaf); a voice that would articulate and answer the need, we cannot, as yet, express (dumb). This realisation is a moment of awakening. The very thought system that turned away in the first place (crowd) brings to awareness (Christ) just how poor in spirit (deaf and dumb) we are. Through observation He opens our soul in His (spittle), and we hear and speak in Spirit.

Observation flowers best in silence and stillness... when we slow down and do one thing at a time. When you eat, eat; when you sit, sit; when you think, think, and so on. There is a place for multitasking in the world but not in Spirit. One thing at a time is enough. There is nowhere to go because He is our destination... and He is found within.


