THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

From Father Anthony

For several days we had low dark cloud, curtains of rain and refrigerated temperatures. People moved hurriedly with umbrellas unfurled. Tires squelched and headlights twinkled in the gloom. Only the brave and determined ventured over the sands. *'How much longer',* said one lady exasperatedly. On the third morning, dark oily clouds began to evaporate and drift eastwards over the sea. And out came the sun, hot and beaming. Streets steamed in the heat and relaxed; people found their smiles again. There had been a transformation!

"…He was transfigured before them.' The word translated as *transfigured* is metamorphoó: μεταμορφόω… from which we get *metamorphosis* and *metamorphize*. Loosely it means to *transform*. The first part *meta* means *with*… the change that takes place after being *with* something or someone. Morphoo conveys a change of form *(outer expression)* so that it embodies the essential *(inner)* substance, *i.e.* form harmonises with inner essence, inner reality. Always being one *with* the Father in His inner substance, Jesus' outer form radiates with wisdom, power and love (*Moses, Elijah and Jesus*). Inner and outer harmonise. Very often we are not in harmony; our outer person does not reflect our inner being: there is a pretence.

Transfiguration encapsulates spiritual life. By conforming our inner life to the Father our outer life harmonises *with* and reflects it. *Spiritual life* is often understood to mean something set apart from *'normal life'*. This is a misunderstanding. Spiritual life is part of and fulfils normal life. It may be left dormant but it is always there waiting to grow. It is the wheat that grows among the weeds. It must be so entwined with *'normal life'* that it grounds, stabilises and raises *'normal life'* to levels where the Author of all Life shines through. It raises life above selfishness, greed, harshness, deception, violence, war and so on. It is the yeast that makes life palatable.

Everyone is called to this Life. Everyone can be *transfigured*. It is not for the few or the chosen; it is for all. We are all unique and as such we are all chosen. Spiritual life, therefor, is not an option: it is a necessity. Like Peter we must learn to pitch the three tents of our body, soul and spirit in the Father so that we radiate Him in us. Then, coming down the mountain of His Love... love is what we bring to the world.

THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD SUNDAY 6 AUGUST

In the Transfiguration Christ enjoyed for a short while that glorified state which was to be permanently His after His Resurrection on Easter Sunday. The splendour of His inward Divinity and of the Beatific Vision of His soul overflowed on His body, and permeated His garments so that Christ stood before Peter, James, and John in a snow-white brightness. The purpose of the Transfiguration was to encourage and strengthen the Apostles who were depressed by their Master's prediction of His own Passion and Death.
