ADVENT WEEK 2 (B)

From Father Anthony...

I sat outside with a cup of steaming tea; cold seeped through my jumper. The garden reminded me of lank hair... when I had some! The Gunslinger squared up to me. The sky was blue and transparent; wisps of candy floss in the distance. Much later, wrapped and huddled, I sat outside again, immersed in darkness and a world of silhouettes. A bat skittered past, dancing the silence. Only now, in darkness, would the black velvet sky reveal what daylight obscured... twinkling little jewels; the firmament was alive with them.

'... John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance...' An historical figure, John the Baptist also represents a state of being. He represents that stage of development when we begin to perceive that Christ is found within; when we start observing our inner world. He *immerses* himself – $\beta \alpha \pi \pi i \zeta \omega$, baptism, to submerge, immerse' - in the wilderness of his own being, the realm of mind. He encounters the chattering subvocal voice and his conditioning; his behaviour and reactions; voices from the past; what keeps him bound or loosed (all Judaea and the people of Jerusalem made their way to him). He begins to understand the obstacles to his spiritual growth – ἁμαρτία, sin, missing the mark. The light of understanding twinkles in this darkness (appeared in the wilderness). It provides the conditions for him to have a change of mind- μετάνοια, repentance, a change of mind. Observation, (watching) leads to understanding and understanding to change.

The 'John' state leads us to Christ by heightened natural perception, which, in itself, is a form of light (understanding). It leads us beyond worldly consciousness to seek Christ in spiritual consciousness, hidden within. But, perception of light is not the Light (not fit to undo his sandals) ... an important learning point! Immersing ourselves within the wilderness of our own being, understanding sin, having a change of heart reveals a great deal, but it is not Him. It is the necessary preparation to receive Him. When He will come we do not know; that is not ours to determine. That He will come is guaranteed. Our task is to prepare the 'ground' (make his paths straight); His promise is to walk on it. As we straighten our path by gently removing the obstacles that obscure spiritual sight, we recognise who it is walking along the path of our life; He comes forth.
