From Fr Anthony...

Shrieking winds swirled and battered, keeping hooded heads down. The sea bulged, pulsed and exploded against the harbour wall. Huge fountains of foaming water leapt into the air drenching the unwary. Out on the surf, crested waves raced at angles colliding in a maelstrom of froth. The sun had gone somewhere warmer! Clouds billowed in twists of slate grey and dirty white. Rain tattooed the ground like a squad of hobnails boots in a hurry. It was fantastic but discordant. Later, exhausted of energy, all was silent and colourless. Nature had blown herself out.

The day before, people had moved lazily with grace and ease. Dogs had barked and splashed. The sea, steel blue and flat as a mirror, reflected puffs of white cloud drifting across a turquoise sky. A light breeze fanned the air; the sun had smiled. Nature's instruments were in tune creating a lovely symphony.

Sometimes, for longer or shorter periods, we experience life as discordant. Nothing quite fits; we're all over the place; we feel flat and exhausted. There are days when life moves smoothly; like wearing a familiar jacket, it feels comfortable. Up and down we go; discordant one day, in harmony the next.

The scriptures urge awareness of this pattern if we wish to break it; they reveal the key to balance and harmony. In essence, who I am, must confront who I think I am (the sinning brother). One hits the mark, the other misses it... it is an illusion. When illusion masquerades as reality, life lacks spiritual substance; nothing quite fits; we feel discordant. Who I am must gently but firmly remove who I think I am (have it out with your brother). Living as who I am places me in reality; living as who I think I am places me in a dream of reality.

In reality, I leave the robotic, conditioned dream-life for self-aware conscious living. Soul and Spirit harmonise... pull in the same direction (where two agree). The word 'agree', in Greek, is sumphoneó... from which we get symphony. I see things as they are, not as I think they are; I accept (bind) that which assists harmony; I loose (deny) that which hinders it. Body, soul and spirit unite. Unified they reflect the character of Christ (where two or three are gathered in my name). I live as He lives... I enjoy harmony and reflect His peace.
