From Father Anthony...

Sunday morning: torrential rain. Wind squalled and gusted dangerously. Menacing clouds stretched and sped over the city. Trees, nestling below the Great Spire, bent alarmingly and shook like dogs out of water. Leaves filled the air and swirled down the street. Doors slammed. I sheltered in the porch and took in the violent magnificence of it all. Then, out of the tumble of greys and inky blues, a double rainbow emerged and filled the sky with colour. For a moment I had a sense of myself watching it all.

'He sat down opposite the treasury and watched'. The word for 'watched' – θεωρέω – conveys a sense of 'gazing (contemplating) in order to analyse (discern)'. This quality of 'gazing' is an ability acquired through spiritual practice. If prayer is about communication with God, then meditation is about stilling the mind and 'watching' the self who is doing the communicating. Watching gives an experience of 'I'; the watcher, watching; thought, thinking: sight, seeing. It is through watching that we come to understand those areas of our lives that need purifying: areas of our lives that are out of balance, top heavy and weigh us down.

Through 'watching' we become aware of the lack of harmony between thought, word and deed. In harsher terms we catch sight of our hypocrisy; the manner in which we claim to have higher standards or more noble beliefs than we actually do. The word hypocrite, ὑπόκρισις, literally means 'someone acting under a mask'. In Gospel terms we see how we 'swallow the property of widows...'; how we puff ourselves up. We discern the difference between our 'act' and reality.

When we become aware of the 'act' we see the system of thought, word and deed that supports it. These are the 'riches' that confirm us in the illusion of ourselves and establish our worldly persona: what is left over we give to a spiritual persona which costs us very little because it is false. Awareness of this purifies because by spotting the illusion we drop the act. We die to it (become a widow). Reality (Truth) dawns. In the presence of such power and magnificence (God) we feel as if we are nothing. It is this nothing we give to God... it is all we have. Nothing means not-a-thing. It is not a thing we give to God but our Self - which is beyond label. It is everything!


