From Father Anthony

I opened the church and lit a candle. The sky was a pale blue wash with pink edges and slits of golden red. A low mist rolled in. The sun changed gears with the traffic and hurriedly started its climb, scattering light everywhere. A pigeon raced across rooftop; gangsters squawked. And still the mist rolled in: until it covered everything. The sun, now a ghostly disc, gathered momentum and with a huge effort picked up the misty air and dissolved it. Brilliant!

Whoever does not pick up his cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. There is way of reading this sentence as, whoever does not pick up the cross which is himself cannot be my disciple. The word Cross (σταυρός stauros) has the meaning of an upright - an upright pole, very often with a cross beam. If we look at ourselves, we have a spine, the upright, and a crossbeam, the shoulders. The physical, sensory, worldly body is our cross. It is the instrument through which we get all our sensory information which we identify with and form confusing images of who we think we are. Contained in, attached to and crucified on this body of sense is the person of spirit... who we truly are; it was before and continues after the physical body is dissolved. Life is changed not ended with death. Death is the beginning of new life, resurrection, beauty... life to the full. This we can have now, if we desire it. The person of spirit must learn to pick up their bodily cross, which gives nothing but pain and illusion, and lead it on a new interior path... the path that Jesus took. It involves dying to the sensory to be reborn in the spirit. Instead of the physical attempting to carry the spiritual, the spiritual must carry and guide the physical...pick it up. As St Paul said, we must transform from an animated being into a life-giving spirit.

A first step is to recognise our sensory, worldly nature and *hate* it (*hate father, mother, etc*). This *hate* is comparative. It means to rely less on the senses in favour of discerning the spirit within; we rely less on father, mother, brother, etc, as sensory objects and labels as we discern our common spiritual reality in God. We rise above the sense world, relate to it from spirit and thus transform it.

TERMINALLY ILL ADULTS BILL IN THE HOUSE OF LORDS

With the expected second reading next Friday 12 September, Archbishop Sherrington has again raised key concerns.

- Threat to Care Homes and Hospices: May pressure institutions to act against their ethical principles or reduce services.
- Inadequate Conscience Protections: Healthcare professionals could be forced to participate indirectly, undermining their moral autonomy.
- **Risk to Vulnerable Patients**: Safeguards are seen as weak, increasing the risk of coercion or pressure to end life.
- Impact on Palliative Care: Legalising assisted suicide could divert resources away from essential end-oflife care.

This land was conveyed to the Diocese of Clifton, along with an endowment for the construction of a new church. The Chapel was built in 1949 by a Salisbury-based firm and was consecrated in 1950.
