**BLESSED MARGARET POLE - CELEBRATION, FARLEIGH HUNGERFORD CASTLE** A local English Martyr - Margaret was widowed, named Countess of Salisbury; she had five sons, including Reginald Cardinal Pole. She opposed Henry's marriage to Anne Boleyn, and the king exiled her from court, although he called her "the holiest woman in England." She was never given a legal trial. She was seventy when she was martyred. In 1538, her other two sons were executed. A celebration of her life at Farleigh Hungerford Castle (BA2 7RS) on Saturday evening 26 May at 6pm.

#### POPE FRANCIS - CONTINUES CATECHESIS ON BAPTISM

In our continuing catechesis on Baptism, we now turn to the central action of the baptismal rite. Through the pouring of water and the invocation of the Blessed Trinity, we are "immersed" in the mystery of Christ's death and rising to new life. Thus reborn, we become a new creation, passing from the corruption of sin to eternal life. In Christ, and by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, we are made adoptive children of the Father, with the Church as our spiritual mother. This relationship is definitive and is sealed by an indelible mark on the soul. Henceforth, as members of Christ's body, we are committed to avoid sin and to conform our lives ever more fully to him. Following our rebirth in the waters of baptism, we are anointed with sacred chrism as a sign of our sharing in Christ's role as priest, prophet and king. As members of God's priestly people, we are called to offer our lives daily as a sacrifice pleasing to him. As a royal and prophetic people, we are called to proclaim Christ's kingship by our witness of faith and love, and our commitment to imitate him in loving service to our brothers and sisters.

#### YEAR OF MISSION - SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

This Communications Sunday offers us a clear and obvious reminder of all that we are called *be* in this Year of Mission. We are to communicate the gospel to others. We do that, not simply by what we say or what we write, but by who we are and how we live. This last week has seen us celebrate the Ascension and hearing the call of Jesus to go out to the whole world and proclaim good news. Today's Gospel seems to pick up something of what we have already heard over Easter... 'as you sent me so I send them'. This is Jesus' mission living on in the disciple. That's us! We're in that time of praying, thirsting and waiting for the outpouring of the Spirit. This week, find yourself praying 'Come, Holy Spirit' and pray for the courage and the strength, the wisdom, the discernment and the understanding to be caught up in the mission Jesus to proclaim the Father's love and to touch the world with the power of Jesus' healing and compassion. That's a good news worth proclaiming!
