From Father Anthony...

Like jagged streaks of lightning, early morning sunlight squeezed through cracks in the dark mottled cloud. Waves pulsed against the sea wall sending up spumes of spray. Desultory figures ambled along the beach; dogs splashed and barked. I sat on a cliff top. Terns and Kittiwakes circled and dived. The sand below was littered with fallen rocks; water sucked and swirled. Underlying it all a salty breeze murmured through gaps in the cliff face.

With spiritual practice we get used to aspects of 'self'. One aspect is a 'murmuring' below the surface of our thoughts. It may manifest as feelings of discontent, a knot in the tummy, sporadic irritation or disappointment.

Jesus said, 'stop complaining'. The word used is $\gamma o \gamma \gamma \dot{u} \zeta \omega$, gogg $\dot{y} z \bar{o}$. It means, 'to murmur' or 'mutter' – like the sound of cooing doves. There are many reasons for this 'murmuring'. Spiritually, it may occur when with appropriate practice and genuine desire and intention for the experience of God... nothing happens! It's similar to when our prayers seem to go unheard and unanswered. We murmur to ourselves, feel let down, don't understand why. Disappointed, we may give up and go back to our old ways.

Remember St Francis? 'What we are looking for, is what is looking'... the I Am. God and Self (I Am) are inextricably linked; the Image of the other. That's why we can't find Him. It is like an eye trying to see itself, a house trying to live in itself. It's not something out there, it is who we truly are; the Image of the Father, I Am. We cannot do it because we are it. Without this understanding it becomes frustrating... we 'murmur'. It has to be revealed to us, (taught).

Revelation takes place when we are drawn out of ourselves to 'see' ourselves, 'No one can come to me unless he is drawn by the Father who sent me, and I will raise him up at the last day'. Self is shown Self (raised up) ... revelation. In seeing Self we see God because we are His Image. Revelation, is a work of God in us. We do not earn or merit it; we prepare for it, so as to recognise it when it happens. With patience and perseverance we rest in the desire and intention for God... 'If it seems slow, wait for it; it will surely come; it will not delay'. (Habakkuk 2.3)

Contactless Payments at St Osmund's

The use of cash has been in decline for many years and, since the pandemic began and the use of cash was discouraged, many of us no longer carry cash. We rely instead on contactless payment in shops, on public transport and many other places. Because of this, and in response to requests from parishioners, we are setting up a contactless card reader for donations at St Osmund's Church. This will be located at the entrance to the church and will work in conjunction with a new 'Donate' page on our website. Both the card reader and the new webpage should be implemented within the next couple of weeks.

Gift Aid - The new card machine and the website page will have the ability to add Gift Aid to your donation (if you are an eligible taxpayer and wish to do so). The first time you use the machine and wish to add Gift Aid, you will need to input your details but thereafter, once your payment card is registered, the card reader and the 'Donate' webpage will recognise it the next time you make a payment.

Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross - 9 August

Academia excluded her for being a woman, her mother rejected her for following her vocation and the Nazis ultimately murdered her for Jewish heritage. Edith Stein, or St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, whose feast day we celebrate this week died what many may see as a senseless death at the hands of a merciless ideology. But through her faith in the Cross, she allowed God to transform her suffering and death into a message of love and redemption for the world. Memorial of Saint Clare of Assisi - 11 August

Clare was 18 years old when she heard St Francis preach in the cathedral of Assisi during the Lent of 1212. His words on contempt of the world and on penance and particularly the holy example he set, so earnestly affected Clare, that she conferred with him and soon recognised that God was calling her to lead a life similar to his in the seclusion of a convent. Memorial of Saint Maximilian Kolbe - 14 August

Maximilian became a Franciscan in 1907 and devoted his life to fostering a devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. During World War II, Fr Kolbe hid as many as 2,000 Jewish and Polish people in his Polish monastery. In 1941, Maximilian was arrested by the Nazis who sent him to Auschwitz concentration camp. Here he gave his life for another man who had a family. He is remembered for his prophetic words "Hatred is not a creative force. Only love is a creative power."
