ADVENT WEEK 2 (C)

From Father Anthony

Shop fronts reflected off wet, slippery streets. Cars squelched; people bustled. It was a drab day. But, sights, sounds and aromas from the Christmas Market transformed it all, lifted spirits and gave the square an Alpine feel. Near the supermarket a gentleman of the road sat swathed in coats and blankets; he looked fed up and forlorn. A lady in front of me stopped abruptly, rummaged in her bag and, with a lovely smile, gave him something. She had come to a decision, a judgement and acted; I followed her beautiful example.

Last week we looked at Death; this week *Judgment*. Judgment, in the West, has predominantly negative connotations. For the Hebraic mind it has both a positive as well as a negative feel. God can judge in our favour as well as against us. As a rule of thumb, Scriptural understanding of judgment largely has to do with, *to do the right thing*. The woman saw a man in need and did the right thing; she responded to his need; she exercised a *holy* (*qadosh*, ,(vi)) positive judgment.

In the Gospel we read about Tiberias Caesar, Pontius Pilate, Herod, Philip, Annas, Caiaphas and John. Each of these historical personalities also represent aspects of our own being or mind. John is the internal aspect of Spirit (the desert): the others represent worldly aspects that not only tie us to the world but hinder us from hearing, recognising and approaching God and letting God approach us.

If we are to exercise right judgment - do the right thing - like John, we must regularly go into the internal desert of our being and listen for the voice of the Lord (Jesus). His voice will help us discern between the worldly and the spiritual; the things of this world and the things of God. It will help us to judge in favour of Spirit so that we can bring Spirit into the world and in all things reflect the Will of God (prepare a way of the Lord). The bleakness of Advent characterises this desert; and into it something beautiful and beyond compare must be born in you and me. We must learn to judge in favour of Jesus so we can feel Him judge in favour of us. "If in your heart you make a manger for his birth then God will once again become a child on earth".
