THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

From Father Anthony

Head down against the rain I hurried back from a meeting and got soaked. I changed and dried off. Gangsters danced and squabbled on the lawn. Their quarrelsome mood matched my own as I glared at low black cloud, a bedraggled garden and buckets of rain. But, as I watched two collared doves descended gracefully, landed and began pecking away together. The gangsters flew off and the scene of chaos and confusion was replaced by one of gentle serenity.

This week we celebrate the baptism of Jesus. Baptism ($Ba\pi ri\zeta\omega$) means to 'immerse', (dip under), and John means, 'graced by God'. Spiritually, John represents a state of soul which, by God's grace, becomes aware of the spiritual reality behind all physical manifestations. This awareness creates the conditions where our physical senses serve to increase our spiritual awareness. We immerse (baptise) ourselves into a life where spirit, rather than our thoughts and senses, guides our life. How?

A good place to start is to become aware of what we are actually immersed in. That is, what is our predominant mood in life. Interiorly, are we predominantly bright, open, relaxed and content or are we quarrelsome, fearful, antagonistic, self-seeking, angry, despairing, confused and so on. If with prayer and reflection we find we are not happy or content with what we find then something is not right; something needs adjusting.

It is this life that Jesus wants to come into. We may not feel worthy but it is into our life as it is (warts and all) that He asks to enter, (It is I who need baptism from you', said John', and yet you come to me!'... Jesus says, 'leave it like this for the time being'). Jesus wants to join us as we are... not where we could or should be. Just as He comes into the physical world as a baby needing our care and attention, so he comes into our life as we are now. He asks to be immersed into our lives as they actually are. We can only love Him as we are. This love draws or invites Him in. In effect we immerse Him into our world which is like drawing light into darkness. His entry will have an effect. Like the dove descending, His presence will draw our mood out of darkness into His own wonderful Light until we are truly immersed (Baptised) in Him.



POPE EMERITUS BENEDICT XVI REQUIESCAT IN PACE

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, who served as Supreme Pontiff from April 2005 to February 2013 died at 9.34am on 31 December.

Cardinal Vincent Nichols, President of the Bishops' Conference, in part of his statement said:

"I am deeply saddened to learn of the death of Pope Benedict. He will be remembered as one of the great theologians of the 20th century".

"He was through and through a gentleman, through and through a scholar, through and through a pastor, through and through a man of God – close to the Lord and always his humble servant".
