From Father Anthony

I felt tired and irritably overwhelmed by all the *process* that clogs up the church and society... and took myself off to Old Sarum. I looked down over a patchwork of mustard yellow and green stretching away toward Boscombe and Amesbury. The sky was clear with a gentle breeze. I relaxed and watched the *jumps plane* lumber off the strip and gain altitude. It droned as it climbed and circled overhead. Then, the engine note softened: little specks fell from it, descending at a frightening rate! My heart was in my mouth until one after the other blue chutes opened and with great skill twisted and turned onto the drop zone.

Ephphatha 'be opened'. How often is there a sense of falling headlong into the world; day after day after day; bombarded by the noisy demands, advertising, news, politics; in short, the whole social paraphernalia that informs what we listen to and influences what we say: that leaves us deaf to the Word (Mind) of God and dumb in the Voice of the Spirit which are natural for us as spiritual beings! No wonder there is tension in our lives.

Only Jesus can stop this headlong fall by opening up our spiritual ears and loosening our spiritual tongue. And He will do it if we let Him. Too often we pay Jesus lip service or treat Him as a concept, an idea or a sort of mystical Disney character from a spurious past. Perhaps that's how the world silences Him and the Truth!

Our spiritual journey is about remembering and embracing Jesus as a Living Person; a Person who is accessible to us in Spirit; whom we can meet and experience. He is the Second Person of the Trinity, God Made Man, our Brother; in whom and by whom the whole of Creation comes about and by whom it is sustained, *All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life; and the life was the light of men. (Jn1:3-4).*

If we allow Him to be God in our lives; if we hand over everything to Him and get out of the way of ourselves: He will *take us off by Himself*, in spirit, and open for us the wonders of our Being in Him; *our ears will hear His Word and our Mouths proclaim His faith (Baptism Rite)*.
