From Father Anthony

Having managed to slice open my wrist 'gardening', I taped it up and then went into the kitchen... and sliced the tip of my little finger. Not a good day! Later, I sat outside looking like a bandage and wondered at my own stupidity and very distracted mind. Tall pink roses looked down at me shaking their heads at my ineptitude; the gunslinger flitted over sensing an easy target. The sky was pasty. Beneath it, high on the church roof cross, perched a solitary bird. He looked away into the distance. He seemed calm, detached and focused. I had much to learn! His stance reminded me of a line from Plotinus, 'the way to truth is the journey of a lonely person to that which is eternally alone'.

We carry and can become tied to a great deal of baggage during our lives; no wonder we get distracted. Our minds can resemble a mass of wires scattered in all directions. We are conditioned by social laws, weighted down by belief systems, attracted to that which we desire but which comes to dominate us. We fall prey to the expectations of others and attempt to mimic their dance rather than finding our own. There is a sense in which like two oxen, yoked together in a field, we are yoked to all that makes us tired, weary and overburdened. And into lives such as these Jesus enters saying, "Come to me, all you who labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest".

His yoke is light and easy precisely because it entails giving up on or letting go of all the things that tie us down. He does not replace like for like. Eternally alone, because He is enough and sufficient in and for Himself, He is eternally present. He is found by giving up on or letting go of all that ties us down; when the distractions are gone He is what remains. It is the journey of the lonely because only you and I can make it; no one can make it for us... no law, no creed, no expectation. In that aloneness we find Him who is always present. By living in the world but not of it we ascend more and more into the active silence of God where we find rest so as to become like Him; ever alone yet ever present for all.



These deliveries also continually reinforce our profile in the local community and ensure that literally thousands of householders know there is a Catholic church nearby that is ready and keen to welcome them.
