LENT WEEK 1(C)

From Father Anthony

My head was a blizzard: thoughts tumbled and turned and, on my way to Wardour, I had taken the Road to Warminster! With some less than eloquent language I rectified the error. However, the children's Mass inspired and calmed me; I realised I needed some 'time out'. Later, I parked up, found a tree and sat. Salisbury nestled in the distance. I took in the Cathedral, worked out where St Osmunds and St Gregory's were, found the Station and gently came home to myself. I had let the world get on top of me and left Jesus behind somewhere... something else to rectify!

Writing to the Church in Rome, St Paul quotes from Deuteronomy, the word is very near you, in your mouth and in your heart (Rom 10:8|Deut 30:14). If we substitute the name Jesus for the Word - Jesus is the Word of God - then we could also say that Jesus is very near us, He is in our mouths and our hearts. If we do not understand this or feel it not to be true: or if we want it to be true but can't see how it can happen; then perhaps we need the season of Lent.

The word Lent comes from the old English Lenctern which means *spring season*. With spring comes the sense of clearing out the old for the new; the stale for the refreshing; a grimace for a smile. Like Jesus we might need to go into the desert of our being and examine what we find there. To what extent have we put our trust in material things - *turn these stones into bread*. Who do we actually acknowledge as rulers of this world - governments, corporations, media, etc. Which of these do we trust in *(worship me)*. How much of our thinking and feeling is actually *putting God to the test;* living by dreams rather than spiritual action *(throw yourself down)*.

What we do, say, think, feel or 'how we are in the world' affects the world. Apparently, 'the world' is in a mess; if so, that's because we're in a mess. The remedy is not to blame others but for each of us to clean up our own mess, by finding Jesus in the desert of our being and fusing in love with Him. Others will then feel Him in our hearts and hear Him in our words.
