From Father Anthony

It was a gusty Autumn evening. Memories of summer floated on the wind. Blue sky faded away to the horizon; clouds raced towards the West. The sea boiled; waves fought like hares on a ploughed field. Those that escaped the fight crashed against the sea wall. Rainbows beamed as dangerous spumes of water filled the air and drenched the promenade. One man judging the angle of each wave with perfect timing leaned against the sea railing, took a picture and darted away with less than a second to spare. He moved with ease between being soaked on one side and getting too far away from the action on the other... and his photos were spectacular.

Jesus travelled along the border between Galilee and Samaria. This *middle way* is important. Galilee can represent *life activity*: Samaria, the *intellectual consciousness*. One ploughs its energy into material things while the other speculates on what could be and how things come about... but never grounds itself by actually doing anything. One represents *a path of darkness* the other *a path of light*. When we stray too far in either direction our thoughts, feelings, words and actions become unbalanced or diseased *(ten lepers can represent the ten possible directions of our five senses)*. Jesus walks a path between the two... the path of harmony and peace (*Jerusalem*). This pathway, the Way of Christ, utilises and commands both light and dark: it creates its own path. The three paths are often depicted in representations of the Crucifixion. One thief is depicted as accepting his fate and looks at Christ; the other, his head turned away, scorns Christ. The first is intellectual light; the other our earthbound materialism.

The Gospel urges us to resolve the ten possible pathways of our five senses into one, the path of Christ (*one came back giving thanks*). We might reflect: is their use primarily intellectual... do we mentally fly from the world and rest in lofty ideas of spirit and become ungrounded? Or, do we use our senses solely for material pleasure and gain and disparage spirit? Either way we are off centre. The example Christ gives is to enter the world in all its fulness and terror (*dying on the cross and descending into hell*) and raise it up again by *enlivening the spirit* contained within all we find and experience. This is the way of transformation leading to Peace.


