June 22nd 7 p.m. CLIFTON CATHEDRAL Three of us had intended going to this service for the distribution of the Diocesan synod result. A few days before the event, Clifton warned us to leave more time due to a local concert, and what with Glastonbury traffic and Rail chaos we decided to look at the Live streaming instead. This is still available as a recording on Clifton Diocese website https://cliftoncathedral.org/ and I enthusiastically recommend you watch at least Bishop Declan's homily (which can be found at 25.5 if the whole service seems a bit much!) Just following that Pope Francis message is also inspiring. It was though, an interesting liturgy. The Bishop and one other priest, on a simple looking altar with an eager musician arranging rather eclectic introductory hymn singing got us into the mood. We had thoughtful readings and Bidding prayers from three young, a priestly Gospel reading from Luke 24. The road to Emmaus the literal and spiritual journey and then Bishop Declan spoke. He told us 80 % of parishes and 65% schools, each with different levels of input had taken part. The resume which will be sent to each Parish and which is now available was made after reading 1,500 sheets of paper!

The Bishop said we would be listened to and he read from Jeremiah where God says He will listen. It was a sensitive homily: Bishop Declan was humble, apologetic and understanding about the effect on us of the abuse. He spoke about the future and told us we are called to be people of Hope and he told us of the importance of the young. He touched (non controversially!) on women's role in the church and ecumenism. There was a short and rather moving message from Pope Francis telling us that we could be the individual who brings hope and that the individual becomes "us". It made good watching. *Krysia*

In September and October this year, the relics of St. Bernadette will journey on pilgrimage through England, Scotland and Wales. St. Bernadette's relics will be visiting Clifton Cathedral on Saturday 10th September 2022 for one day. This will be a unique opportunity to experience the special gifts and charisms of Lourdes.
