Divine Mercy Sunday 11th April: From the diary of a young Polish nun, Sr Faustina Kowalska, concerning revelations that she received about God's mercy, a special devotion began spreading throughout the world in the 1930s. The message is nothing new but is a reminder of what the Church has always taught through scripture and tradition: that God is merciful and forgiving and that we, too, must show mercy and forgiveness. However, in the Divine Mercy devotion, the message takes on a powerful new focus, calling people to a deeper understanding that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone- especially the greatest sinners. This Feast was granted to the Universal Church by Pope John Paul II at the canonisation of Sr Faustina on 30th April, 2000

The Tea With The SVP campaign, which runs from 19-23 April and coincides with **National Tea Day** on 21 April, invites the nation to enjoy a cuppa while raising funds for the SVP's Covid Recovery Programme and it's regional Community Support Projects. Donations to the Covid Recovery Programme throughout the week will be matched up to a total of £5,000 by a corporate benefactor. The SVP was founded on 23 April 1833 by a group of students in Paris led by Blessed Frédéric Ozanam to help impoverished people living in the slums of the French capital. The Society's compassionate work is needed more than ever today as the world attempts to survive in the era of Covid with its attendant poverty and suffering. The week of celebration surrounding the Tea With The SVP campaign also includes the birthday of the organisation's patron saint St Vincent de Paul, who was born on 24 April 1581.
