A message from Mark Overall, parishioner and also chair of Wiltshire Historic Churches Trust *With three weeks to go until the annual Ride & Stride event on Saturday 12th September my thanks to churches that have already committed to participate in this key church building fundraising event and my encouragement to all other churches to take part. Participation can be very modest; it is the sense of fun and fulfilment from your fund raising support to Wiltshire Churches and your own church that counts. Therefore, be imaginative about how you participate e.g. doing sponsored laps of the church yard. If you are visiting churches there is no requirement to go inside or to get a signature if that is not possible or not possible safely. Self certification of the visit is sufficient.*

The idea of celebrating 1 September as a day of prayer for creation began at the wish of the Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios in 1989, and was endorsed by Pope Francis in 2015. The season runs from September 1 to October 4, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. During this season we are encouraged to pray and engage in community events in order to deepen our relationship with our God, our neighbour and the earth we share, being ever more attentive to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.

In addition to the resources offered here (*on Clifton website*) we will also provide weekly reflections starting on August 30th which can be used by individuals or perhaps on-line with your different parish groups.
