From Father Robert: This last week's Office of Readings carried extracts from St Cyril of Jerusalem's instructions to catechumens. There were 24 instructions. Cyril lived c315-386. Catechumens are adults under instruction preparatory to being baptized at Easter, and Cyril - then Bishop of Jerusalem - delivered these instructions during Lent, probably in the year 347 - so some 1700 years ago! They are extremely thorough. Here are some things to ponder at this time when Covid-19 places limitations on how we may gather.

He said, 'The Church, Catholic or universal, gets her name from the fact that she is scattered through the whole world from the one end of earth to the other, and also because she teaches universally and without omission all the doctrines which are made known to mankind, whether concerned with visible or invisible things, with heavenly or earthly things. Then again, because she teaches one way of worship to all men, whether nobles or commoners, learned or simple; finally because she universally cures and heals every sort of sin which is committed by soul or body.....'

'The Church, that is, the assembly, is designated by this apt term because it assembles all and brings them together.... About the same holy Catholic Church, Paul writes to Timothy: "that you may know how to live in the household of God, which is the Church of the living God, the pillar and bulwark of the truth"'.

Then Cyril added, 'The Church is called *Catholic*: such is the proper name of the holy Church which is the mother of us all.... Moreover, she fulfils the type and carries out the pattern of the Jerusalem which is from above, which is free and the mother of us all. Though at first she was childless, she is now the parent of a mighty family'.

'....In this holy Catholic Church, formed by its teaching and living as we ought, we shall possess the kingdom of heaven and inherit eternal life'.

That is quite a promise! And it is still good for us today. RM
