LIGHTING A CANDLE: Each of us can choose to go on with the little quiet things, pouring all the love we can find in our hearts into them, even if it feels like we haven't found very much. We may discover as we go on that our hearts are growing little by little, and that in them our love grows too. And we do not need to wait until we feel good about ourselves in order to begin. Even if we find ourselves trapped in a shadow dark as death, bound by self-pity or self-hate with no way out, then let us begin anyway. We have nothing to lose by lighting one little candle for our neighbour. We do not have to believe we are good in order to do something good, but when we try we may find that, in fact, there is indeed something good in us after all. We don't need to feel complete, or in control, or impressive in any way to light that candle. And when we do that for our neighbour the light will shine a little on us too. More of our very selves will be revealed to us and we will see that the darkness lied to us and that we really aren't that ugly after all.
