

Pope Francis has invited Catholics and Marian Shrines around the world to dedicate the month of May to a **marathon of prayer** for an end to the Covid-19 pandemic. The initiative involves 30 Marian Shrines around the world. It takes place under the theme "**The whole Church was fervently praying to God,"** which recalls a verse in the Book of Acts (12:5). "The initiative will involve all the Shrines of the world in a special way, so that they might encourage the faithful, families, and communities to recite the Rosary to pray for an end to the pandemic," reads a statement released by the Pontifical Council for Promoting the New Evangelization. Pope Francis will open the Marian month of prayer on 1 May with a Rosary broadcast across Vatican Media's platforms. Each day Vatican News broadcast leads the recitation of the Rosary at 6pm Rome time from the various Shrines taking part in the initiative. The Pope will close the initiative on 31 May with another specially-broadcast Rosary. After more than a year, and with the world still in the grips of the pandemic, the Pope and the Church around the world are leading the way in imploring God for an end to the suffering which so many people are forced to bear.
