Re-opening Churches

The Archbishops wish to make it clear that planning is underway for the re-opening of Catholic churches when restrictions are eased and that discussions with the statutory public health agencies and Government representatives are ongoing.

“As the Government’s restrictions are relaxed step by step, we look forward to opening our churches and resuming our liturgical, spiritual, catechetical and pastoral life step by step. This will also be of service to those beyond the Catholic Church who depend on our charitable activity and outreach through which much goodness is shared by so many volunteers from our communities...

“Together with Catholics across England and Wales, we desire the opening of our churches and access to the sacraments. Until then, we are continuing to pray and prepare.” *The Metropolitan Archbishops are those of the Archdioceses of Westminster, Liverpool, Birmingham, Cardiff and Southwark.*

First Holy Communion group: we hope it won’t be long before we can meet up again. In the meantime, families are working well developing prayer life and participating in livestream Masses. 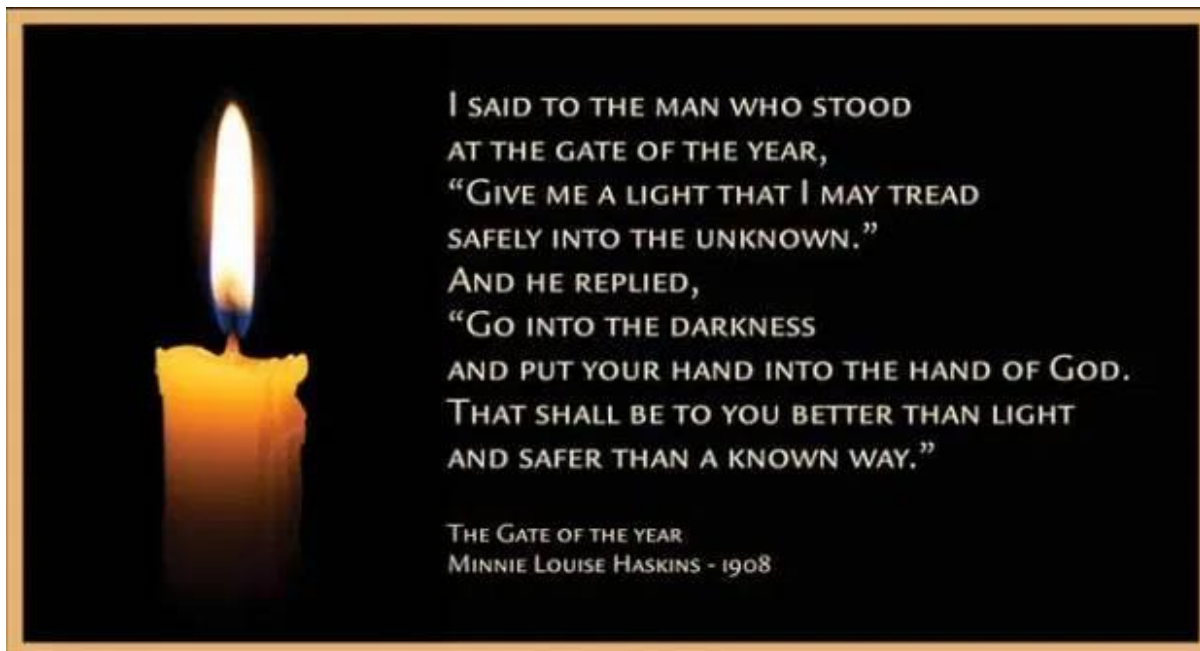
