**From Father Robert:** Boris Johnson's injunction that we should STAY ALERT took me back to childhood and a very happy, if unachieving, membership of a Wolf Cub Pack (=Cub Scouts), where much of the programme was based on Rudyard (erstwhile Tisbury resident) Kipling's Jungle Books. The young Cub, as in Kipling's first volume, had to learn to be vigilant if it was to survive. The opening ceremony each week included squatting with two fingers raised on each side of the head, like a wolf cub's pricked-up ears, learning to stay alert to danger. Things have changed a bit since those days, but today's Cub Scouts are still trained to keep alert, usually through games and learning new skills.

So what about today, for those who were never Cub Scouts (same with Brownie Guides), and all who have left childish things behind? Well, STAY ALERT reminded me of the Lord's injunction to his disciples: 'you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.' (Matthew 24 v 42, 44). Odd as it may sound, the Lord promised to return, and his people are still waiting. So much for the Scout motto, 'Be prepared'. And how should we do that? Well, last week's clean hands etc would be a good start (and some garments - in case you get run over?) because cleanliness has to be not only on the outside, but on the inside. For that we have the sacrament of Reconciliation or Confession (lock-down now allows us to restart using this Sacrament - on request); but not only the formal ritual, for our daily prayers should include an examination of conscience. So, WASH YOUR HANDS, spiritual or otherwise, regularly. And STAY ALERT.

What about KEEP YOUR DISTANCE, keep out of harm's way? Christians try to avoid occasions of sin, not because all of them are particularly wrong, but because eventually we know we will get hurt. And see if our Prime Minister offers any useful advice this week. RM
