Starting School? If you have a child born between **1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017**, please apply **now** for a place at a primary school for admission from **September 2021** onwards. You must complete an application form available from your Local Authority – the County Council of the county in which you reside. If you are applying for Wardour Catholic Primary School, you **must also** provide a copy of the baptism certificate to the school. The closing date is **15 January 2021**. Wardour School is a good choice for parishioners: the school was awarded a Good Ofsted report just before the Covid lockdown, has an excellent Head teacher in Emma Dixon, who is ably supported by a loyal and committed staff. Knitting for AoS: Father hopes to bless the hats at the 9 a.m. Mass on Sunday 20th December which is the delayed Sea Sunday. Please bring any woolly hats you have knitted to the box in the Foyer of Sacred Heart before that weekend.

Have a go at knitting a hat. If you need needles or DK/Aran wool we can provide and the pattern is straightforward (!) Cast on 108 stitches using 4.5 or 5mm needles. K2 P2 for 23cms (9") and cast off by reducing or K2Together. Seafarers are in desperate need and not just for hats.
