Update on Live-Streaming

As you know, the service went live last weekend and I have been receiving wonderful feedback from parishioners who have joined us online for Mass. Some feedback has been of a technical nature and we are very grateful for this. As a result of this feedback we have now retuned the service to allow better streaming to more remote locations/those with slower broadband speeds. Please keep your feedback coming in - we are very interested to hear who is using the service and what impact it is having.



Statistics for our first week - we have had 829 unique viewers visit the site (broken down below by country). Last Sunday, 53 unique viewers stayed with the stream for one hour or more (ie joined us for an entire Mass) and on Monday morning 23 unique viewers 'tuned in' for an hour or more. On Wednesday, we held the funeral of Joan Stevenson RIP and it was wonderful to see that we had 40 viewers tuned in for the entire Requiem Mass. How wonderful that people near and far can now 'join' online with the funeral of someone dear to them, even if they cannot be there in person.

POPE FRANCIS TELLS YOUNG PEOPLE TO LEARN FROM TRADITION

'It is from your roots that you will get the strength to continue.'

The future cannot be understood without reflecting on the past and on the history and traditions passed on to young people from parents and grandparents. "It's from your roots that you will get the strength to continue. None of us – neither you nor me – were manufactured in a laboratory; we have a history, we have roots. And everything we do, the results we achieve, the beauty we create in the future, all comes from those roots. The Pope's message was sent to young people of the Caribbean attending the youth assembly sponsored by the bishops' conference. The conference's theme was focused on transforming the family in accordance with "Amoris Laetitia", the Pope's apostolic exhortation on marriage and family. In his message, he warned young people of the danger of becoming "ageing youths" who are "settled" and do not have the strength to move forward and build a better future. Chapter four is "the heart" of the document's teaching on the family and urged them to study and examine it as a way "of moving the family forward and to transform the family." Pope Francis said, "Study it. Look at it and you will have the guidelines to move forward." Love is never-ending and is an important aspect of family life with "a strength all its own." "St Paul says: 'Faith and hope will end when we are united with the Lord, but love will continue with Him,'" the Pope told the young people. "You are transforming something that is for all eternity; that strength (of love) that will remain forever."

YEAR OF MISSION

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The 'shepherds' that Jeremiah speaks against must have only thought about themselves. It seems that God's people have not been taken care of: the sheep have not been at the heart of the shepherds' mission. Notice who takes over! The Lord will be the shepherd; he will be the one to watch over and care and love and lead... the Lord now sets the benchmark for shepherding. Don't we see that reflected in the familiar psalm? We could use this Sunday's readings to pray for those who shepherd us, who reflect the care of Christ to us and who seek to enable us to find Christ. Let's pray for our priests in their mission of preaching and teaching, and their mission of enabling us to encounter the love of the Lord. Let's pray that they find time for that 'lonely place' to encounter the Good Shepherd, to know his tenderness and look to the example he gives. May our priests know the love of Christ and seek to be like him in the way they radiate Christ's care to those they watch over.
