On Sunday 26 August the World Meeting of Families concludes with a Solemn Eucharistic Celebration that will gather individuals and families from all around the world in thanksgiving and communion. Pope Francis is celebrating this open air Mass in Phoenix Park in Dublin and prior to the Mass, he is also visiting the shrine at Knock.



To watch the event live, go to our website: www.salisburycatholics.org and click on 'Church TV' on the top horizontal menu bar. Next, click on PAPAL MASS. You will then see the livestream from St Osmund's. In the slim grey horizontal bar above the picture, click on 'Pope 2018'.

Due to copyright issues we cannot make this available as a recording and it will only be available as a live broadcast. (i.e. From approx 2pm - 5pm on Sunday 26 August)

If you do not have access to the internet but would like to see the Mass we will be showing it on the large screen in St Osmund's Parish Rooms from 2pm onwards. Everyone is welcome to and join us.

CHURCH TV

As you know, our Church TV (which is accessed via our website: www.salisburycatholics.org) is a continuous 'livestream' from St Osmund's Church. In addition, we record Sunday Masses and other key liturgies (funerals, weddings etc) to enable people to access these at any time. It is our plan to continue to develop our Church TV in all sorts of ways but a priority has been considering how we can include Masses from Holy Redeemer and St Gregory's.

We now have a volunteer from Holy Redeemer and these Masses will feature on their own page. These recordings are uploaded using the video streaming site 'Vimeo' but are still accessed via our website in the same way (by clicking on 'Church TV' in the top menu bar of www.salisburycatholics.org).

We have rearranged the Church TV webpages slightly to accommodate these extra recordings and to make it easier for you to find exactly which service you are looking for. When you click 'Church TV' in our website, you will now be presented with a number of clear buttons that will help you to navigate to exactly what you want to watch. As always - your feedback is appreciated as we try to improve the service and make it as accessible as possible.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS - 7 - 9 September 2018



The bishops of England and Wales are holding a National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Congress in Liverpool in two weeks' time. Eucharistic Congresses are gatherings of clergy, religious and laity which promote an awareness of the central place of the Eucharist in the life and mission of the Church.

The last International Eucharistic Congress in England was held in 1908 when permission for a public procession of the Blessed Sacrament was refused. Participants will engage in a series of sessions focusing on different dimensions of the Eucharist and the daily celebration and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

YEAR OF MISSION : TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

There's a certain sadness in today's Gospel as people walk away from Jesus not being able to 'stomach' the things he says. People walk away from following where he leads because, maybe, what he says is too much for them; it's too challenging. Peter speaks up for the Twelve. Even the Twelve might not fully understand what Jesus is preaching but where else are they to go? The Gospel message fires them up. They know God's love in Jesus; they know God is near to them in Jesus. It doesn't mean they find everything straightforward and simple – even they must have struggled. *Who shall we go to?* You may know people who have drifted away, wandered off, left, walked another journey either because they feel they don't belong or because they feel 'it's not for them'. It doesn't mean we stop caring nor does it mean that they have no place. Ours is a mission of constantly reaching out towards others, not just patting our own backs. You and I cross paths with many who walk different paths and maybe they once walked a similar one to us. Let God's love be revealed in you; let his gentleness shine through; let him walk alongside of them because of you.
