From Father Anthony

I parked up at Old Sarum and took in the magnificent views. A humid breeze curled round my neck; church bells tinkled along the valley. To my right the cathedral, distant and tiny, nestled amid rooftops and clumps of trees; to my left, yellow and brown fields rolled away with gentle elegance towards Amesbury and the Plain. A combine harvester crawled over a golden field: a whining insect devouring and depositing the crop. A tractor followed leaving stacks in its wake. I said a prayer for those who serve by working the land.

Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. The word used for servant is δ oũλος (doulos). It means someone who belongs to another and is often used for those who belong to Christ; who call Him Lord and Master. A quality of the servant of Christ is to remain vigilant. Why? Well, for one reason, what we say or think is often just lip service or obedience to conventions. The lord and master we really serve is what our hearts are set on; what fuels, drives and feeds our desires in the world. This is what we are often vigilant for. Money, bigger houses, better jobs; status, good name, ease of living and so on. Yet, all these are effects; the world is an effect. Effects never satisfy us ultimately; they are fleeting, insubstantial and illusory. They are not the Cause. God is. God is substantial, permanent, nourishing and the very Author of our being. And God is accessible to us now through Christ. It's not that the things of this world are all bad - although some of them are. It's that we must not fool ourselves and confuse Cause with effect. All things are possible with Cause; effects are secondhand and ultimately empty.

It is not always easy to discern Christ in our lives. We may not be able to say who or what Christ is. But, if we exercise vigilance (*keep a good look out*) within our own being we may become aware of what He is not; greed, anger, anxiety, hate, confusion, pride, deceit and so on. Knowing what is not of Christ clears a space in our lives from which we may discern His Presence... *His arrival*. In the light of this Presence, we will be taught and given all that we need (*He will wait on us*).

THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY FRIDAY 15 AUGUST HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION

Thursday 14 August Vigil Mass St Gregory 7pm Friday 15 August Masses: St Gregory 10am, St Osmund Midday & St Osmund 6pm

This significant feast day recalls the spiritual and physical departure of the mother of Jesus Christ from the earth, when both her soul and her body were taken into the presence of God. Pope Pius XII confirmed this belief about the Virgin Mary as the perennial teaching of the Church when he defined it formally as a dogma of Catholic faith in 1950, invoking papal infallibility to proclaim, "that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory". Saint Maximilian Kolbe 14 August – Polish Franciscan priest, missionary and martyr. Saint Maximilian died in the concentration camp at Auschwitz, during World War II, and is remembered as a 'martyr of charity' for dying in place of another prisoner who had a wife and children. He was canonized by Pope St John Paul II on October 10, 1982. He is also celebrated for his missionary work, his evangelistic use of modern means of communication, and for his lifelong devotion to the Virgin Mary.
