LENT WEEK 4(B) LAETARE SUNDAY

From Father Anthony

It was icy cold. Thin light strained through early morning fog. Birdsong and bells echoed eerily in the gloom. I opened the church, lit a candle for us all and, coming out, looked across to where the cathedral and spire should have been! It was hard to imagine that a towering Portland magnificence lay hidden behind natures veil. It would take the heat and light of the sun to reveal it.

Our spiritual 'darkness' is caused as much as by what we do not do (sin of omission) as by what we actually do (sin of commission). By both we can 'miss the mark' (Sin). Spiritually, as with the man born blind, we sit by the wayside of our lives waiting for support and guidance but doing little for ourselves. Awareness of this is a stage of the soul becoming illuminated by Spirit (Christ the Light) rather than being dulled by the world. The spiritual soul of Christ (saliva) mixes with our blind, worldly understanding (the ground). We become spiritually grounded in Him. The awareness is sudden, almost unbelievable and it takes time to process; we know we are in the presence of something magnificent but can't quite make it out. It takes time to filter through the fog of the life we have been living. The Light (recognition) has to burn its way through, by a process of purification... we must wash in the pool of Siloam.

Siloam comes from שלה, shalah. It means to send. We are sent to purify ourselves by overcoming the scepticism and interrogation of our worldly thoughts (neighbours) along with our religio-spiritual beliefs (Pharisees); we must learn to withstand and go beyond all our internal questioning and doubts. It is not an easy time; and, if we talk about it, others often think we have lost the plot! So, it can be a lonely time too. But, it is time well spent because it purifies and spiritualises our thinking, understanding and emotions. Most importantly it leads us back to Christ who was and is the Light that started the process to begin with... only, now, we know it. We are no longer of or about Christ: we come from Christ, as Christ. We are Christ (the Light) in the world. Only gradually did the man born blind come to understand who Jesus (Christ) was and is. And then he told everyone. So must we.



Presentation of the Creed & Second Scrutiny for the Elect

The Elect are those in the final stage of their journey to become fully incorporated into the Catholic Church at Easter through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. The Rites taking place this weekend are embedded in our Year A Scripture with its focus upon turning away from darkness and towards Christ who is The Light. At Friday evening Mass, the Elect will be presented with The Creed so that they, like the Man Born Blind, will be ready to state 'I believe' as they turn away from darkness and towards the light. Our second reading from St Paul reminds us that we are in darkness no more but that we now *are* light in the Lord and that this light must shine through our goodness, right-living and truth. The second scrutiny will take place at the 9am Mass at St Osmund but this is an important occasion in the life of the whole parish and so the Year A scripture will be adopted at all Masses.
