### From Father Anthony

Blackbirds are shrieking later into the lengthening evenings: the air is sweeter with fast approaching spring. I fussed in the garden. The gunslinger swooped and contemplated me with a challenging eye. Mrs Cat lurked; Spivs chattered a noisy warning. Still a mass of bare, skeletal shapes there are hints of new life and the riot of colour to come: even red bloom on the Quince! However, hidden beneath, germinates another resident, one who could easily obscure the natural beauty... bindweed!

'If you wish, you can make me clean'. The word used for clean is katharizó: καθαρίζω... to cleanse, make pure; spiritually, purifying thought from the contamination of error and illusion. Last week we saw Jesus dealing with the reflected effects of attributing to others and the outside world, things, events and feelings that actually originate within ourselves, (projection).

The bindweed of the soul goes deeper. There is stuff we are conscious of but keep hidden (suppression); stuff just out of awareness (subconscious) and stuff we are no longer conscious of it (repression). It all affects us. Spiritually, it is referred to as *leprous* - from lepros: λεπρός, meaning scaly... like the scales of a fish. The many scales or layers of our inner being confuse understanding and experience of who we are, why we are, and what we are, which obscures that we are. That we are (pure consciousness) is prior to who, what and why we are. It is from this Consciousness (Christ) that creation and awareness of everything takes place. It is the power and presence of God. Once again, Jesus touches the leprous soul with his hand... the hand representing His creative ability, the power and presence of God. He restores the leprous soul to its creative consciousness: restores its ability to direct itself, others and the world rather than being led by them.

His hand is found within because Christ, our creative consciousness, through whom everything came into being (Jn1:3) is found within. This is our healing. We must understand: only Christ Heals and only Christ should be acknowledged... not the world (show yourself to the priests): and, when we identify healing with personality (tell it abroad) healing action is closed (He could not openly enter the city). This is why we must rest in and act from our creative consciousness, i.e. prayer in the lonely place which is beyond label but from which everything emerges.

So please, when you come forward for communion, you must consume the host immediately. If you are receiving on the hand, please place your palm flat, pick it up with your other hand, and put it in your mouth before returning to your place. You may wish to take a step to the side to allow the next person to come forward, but please don't walk away until you have consumed the host. It is not permitted to take a host home, or to anybody else, unless you are a special minister taking the Sacrament to the sick, by arrangement with the priest. All of this, of course, is to ensure that the utmost care and reverence is shown to Our Lord, present in the Blessed Sacrament. Thank you.
