EASTER WEEK 4 GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

From Father Anthony

I drove out to see the bluebells, a carpet of blue floating on a sea of green; and the scent! Leaves rustled in the breeze, the sun smiled, as springtime began to say goodbye, a dog barked in the distance. I found the stream, propped up against my favourite tree, closed my eyes and listened. The noise of ugly thoughts scrabbled for attention, but I let them float away to the sound of flowing water.

My sheep hear my voice. There is something about the sound of a loved one. The sound of his or her voice, especially after a long separation; the sound of your child; the sound of a mother or father for a child. There are the sounds of nature; birdsong in the morning, wind in the trees, water flowing, lambs bleating, a cow mooing and so on. We recently had Fr Josephs sisters beautiful dog (Kiwi) staying with us. At first, she was wary but as she grew used to the sounds - and smells - she relaxed, accepted us as she was accepted and became part of our little household. She is gone and we are bereft!

Each of us has our own sound, vibration, frequency. In Genesis 'the spirit hovers over the waters'; the word translated as hover means to vibrate. The universe comes into being through sound and vibration... no wonder Nikola Tesla said, "if you want to find the secrets of the universe, think in terms of energy, frequency, and vibration.". Jesus has His own Sound (Voice). It is **the** sound, **the** frequency, **the** vibration; "through It all came to be and without It nothing came to be that is in being"; through It all is sustained. And His Sound (Voice) is found within; it lives within us. If we are attentive enough, we can encounter this sound, vibration, frequency, energy... His Voice within.

Just as a lullaby soothes fear or stress in a child, so his Voice, his Sound, will soothe our thoughts (*sheep*) of anger, stress, hate, fear, irritability and very much more. His Presence will lead the thoughts of our minds into pleasant pastures as we begin to think, feel and will like Him until, as St Paul says, it is *'not me but Christ in me'*. Then, to be in our presence will be to be in His Presence... and the sound of us will heal the world.

"Peace be with all of you!" - the first words of Pope Leo XIV. The Conclave has elected Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost as the 267th Bishop of Rome. The new Pope was announced to the waiting crowds by Cardinal Protodeacon Dominique Mamberti.

The first Augustinian Pope, Robert Prevost - now Leo XIV - is the second Roman Pontiff from the Americas after Pope Francis. However, unlike Jorge Mario Bergoglio, the 69-year-old Robert Francis Prevost is from the northern part of the American continent, though he spent many years as a missionary in Peru before being elected head of the Augustinians for two consecutive terms.
