ORDINARY TIME WEEK 32 (A) REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY From Father Anthony



The garden has been barbered! Gone the long-haired hippy of carefree summer: now the parade square, short back and sides of prospective winter. Shadows lengthened in the gloaming. I spilt tea: uttered words! The Gunslinger flitted past and perched on rotting vines with a burst of accusatory song. My outer senses were dismayed: I missed the 'hippy'. However, my inner senses knew he would be back, next year... and my spirits brightened. Mrs Cat came over, purred and gave me permission to fuss her.

We live in a physical world in material bodies guided by our senses: sight, hearing, touch, taste and smell. The soul, our life and activating force, utilises these senses in order to negotiate the world. If this is all it does it becomes trapped in and by the world. The senses, used solely to negotiate the world, are represented as the *five foolish virgins*. As incarnated spiritual beings (spiritual beings in a body) we bloom as we 'remember' how to use our senses with Divine Intelligence. When we do they become the five sensible virgins: they lead us from the material to the spiritual realm: they awaken us to the Christ consciousness within, the wedding feast. It is this consciousness that uses the senses to blend the spiritual with the material.... often referred to as enlightenment or illumination. The soul experiences itself as a bride with Christ the Groom; the mystical wedding of heaven with earth. When we need more than the world can offer; when we feel dry and arid: when we long to return to a home we cannot quite remember; when our soul wants to breathe with a new rhythm; when our lamps have grown dim; it is time for action!

By becoming aware of our thoughts, feeling and actions against conscience; by remaining open and pliable: by seeing something good in everything; our senses begin to enlighten or illumine. Instead of just *seeing* physical things we understand their spiritual meaning (as when we *slap head* and say *'oh, I see'*!!). We not only *hear* words but comprehend their creative sound: the life they contain. *Touch* becomes the inner faculty of resonating in sympathy *(feeling)* with everything. *Taste* becomes the ability to discern between opposites for the middle way: and *smell* becomes the intuitive way by which we assemble values. Our senses lead us back to the home we forgot for a while!
