# From Father Anthony

I battled my way along Catherine Street keeping pace with heavy clouds and made my way into the square; it looked lonely with only a few stalls and none of the usual colour and buzz; a *partial market* due to Storm Amy. I managed to get a few things, had a chat and, hood up, made my way back. Seeing the square so uncluttered made me think about the clutter in my own life, my thoughts and actions and how I probably needed a good clear out.

This week's Gospel passage portrays a spiritual journey that we all must make; a journey that ends fear and loneliness and the illusion of separation from God; a journey whose destination is heaven or peace (*Jerusalem, city of Peace*). It entails passing through and dealing with confusions of the intellect and misguided perceptions (*Samaria*) and making an examination of life activities (*Galilee*). This will reveal our *Sin*; where we need a change of mind and heart or... a good clear out. We come to realise that our senses have a dual role; in service of the world but also of the spirit. Ideally, they should be balanced, flowing in both directions. All too often they are stuck in service of the world only. We become stagnant, inert, sinful or leprous (*ten lepers represent the dual nature of the five senses blocked and inert*).

With spiritual practice (the journey to Jerusalem) we not only become aware of this blockage but also our inability to deal with it. Then it is we cry out to Jesus for love, care, forgiveness and healing. In spirit He teaches us how to integrate our mortal and immortal nature: how to connect the material with the spiritual; and understand how the world reflects the spiritual from which it originally emerged (show to the priests). Our dual functioning senses resolve into one leading sense; the sense of feeling. It leads to recognition. Gratitude floods the heart (the leper who gives thanks), as we drop all false images in remembrance of who we truly are... His Image becoming His Likeness.

There is a deep canker and spiritual leprosy in the world today; you don't have to be a *conspiracy theorist* to know it. An external cure for the world begins with an internal cure in your heart and mine as we journey towards and reflect the spiritual Peace of Jerusalem.
