ADVENT WEEK 3 (A) GAUDETE SUNDAY



From Father Anthony.

I woke up during the night to find light pouring through the bedroom window. Thinking I'd left the outside lights on I got up to check. It was the moon... a supermoon! The amount of light was incredible. I went outside to look... it was massive. Stained glass flickered, light bounced off the bird bath; grass, hedges and trees were clearly visible but just beyond colour. It felt spooky and unlike like the light of the sun. I went in looking forward to its later rising and true depth, perspective and colour.

Advent is characterised by darkness and unknowing. We must get used to experiencing God as unknown or as darkness. No concept or thought is wide or elastic enough to stretch around the Infinite and Unbounded, the Cause of everything, in everything yet beyond everything. This darkness may seem strange and spooky and we may cling to comforting ordinary thoughts and concepts to retain some control and shape. But if we persist and allow the darkness and unknown to engulf us; if we let go of images of God and ourselves two things can happen almost simultaneously. Firstly, the darkness reveals how we have imprisoned ourselves by thoughts, feelings, dialogues and relationships which are ultimately directed towards promoting and maintaining our sense of identity, separateness and little ego... felt as depressing, embarrassing and sad. At the same time a different manner of living and being begins to reveal itself within; it is healing, outgoing, altruistic and not selfcentred (are you the one to come?). It is a sense of the Light of God shining within. It is different, wonderful and very deeply personal. It is a stage just before we let go of our earthbound mind for a mind directed by Spirit to the awakening to the Kingdom of Heaven within.... often characterised by cutting one's head off (not literally!). John the Baptist is representative of this stage of 'spiritual development', among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."

There is a different way of living and being in this very troubled world. Only you and I can bring this way. We can either stay trapped and imprisoned or bring freedom by entering the Kingdom of Heaven within and then manifesting it, the Divine light, to the others and the world.

NB - Adoration & Benediction on 16 & 18 December. Due to Carol Services in the church in the evenings, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will only be until Midday when we will have the Angelus and Benediction to finish the time of Adoration.
